





Equine & Rider Protection

Competitors at any ESP Event are automatically enrolled in the Show+ program which provides the following protections should something happen that interferes with one's ability to compete.

Equine

Equine Loss Protection

If your horse is registered to compete, you are eligible for reimbursements should your horse suffer from accident, injury or illness that results in its sudden death or requires its humane euthanasia. Any mortality payment would be a fixed, capped amount and is meant to supplement, but not exceed, any established value that may exist under your own equine mortality insurance policy.

Emergency Medical, Colic, & Surgical

If your horse is registered to compete and suffers from an illness, disease or injury that first manifests itself during one of ESP's events, we will help cover any urgent veterinarian costs, as well as ambulatory transportation to a nearby equine hospital or clinic, in order to stabilize the horse. This includes covering a portion of diagnostic testing, medical treatment, and surgical procedures. Excludes pre-existing conditions, elective or routine maintenance procedures.

Medically Necessitated Scratch

If you've paid various class and entry fees, we will credit your account for all of those costs should you be required to scratch your horse due to illness, injury, disease or death. A veterinarian certificate will be required. Scratches not mandated due to the health problems of the horse are not eligible for credit.

Rider

Should you suffer any injury or fatality while riding a horse that is registered to compete, you (or your estate) will be eligible for reimbursement of up to \$1,000,000 to help defray your medical costs, including ambulatory transportation. As a rider, you will also be eligible to receive a credit to your account for any class and entry fees you've already paid and you're forced to scratch due to such illness or injury. A doctor's certification will be required. Excludes pre-existing conditions, elective or routine health procedures.

THE SPECTATOR'S GUIDE to Equestrian Competition



GRAND PRIX SHOW JUMPING

Jumping is one of the three Olympic equestrian sports, along with Dressage and Eventing. As in all equestrian sports, men and women compete on equal terms. The Olympic sport of Grand Prix show jumping is the highest and most challenging level of jumping competition. Men and women compete over a set course of obstacles that can be as tall as 1.60 meters (5.25 feet) in height. They must clear all of the fences without knocking down a pole in order to return for the second round, also known as the "jump-off," and be the fastest with the least faults to win.

Guide to Scoring in Show Jumping

Penalties in show jumping competitions are referred to as "faults." Knocking down a rail or a pole on a jump is 4 faults, as is putting a foot in the water jump or the first refusal. In all jumper classes, falls and going off-course result in elimination, as does a second refusal.

Show Jumping Faults and Penalties

- Knocking over a jump . . 4 faults
- Refusing a jump 4 faults
- Two refusals Eliminated
- Rider falls off Eliminated
- Over the time allowed . . faults for every second

over the time

HUNTERS

Hunt seat competitions are based upon elegant traditions arising from the foxhunt. Hunters differ from jumpers because they are judged on the style, movement, and technical proficiency of the horse and rider within the constraints of the set course design. Hunters should display jumping ability, manners, style, an even pace, and quality.



CONCOURS DE SAUT INTERNATIONAL: CSI

CSI, an acronym for Concours de Saut International, a show jumping competition recognized by the FEI. As CSI-W, there are World Cup qualifying or World Cup classes at the show, as CSIO there are Olympic qualifying or Olympic classes at the show and designate a team competition.

FEI

Fédération Equestre Internationale is the international governing body for all Olympic equestrian disciplines based in Lausanne, Switzerland.

EQUITATION

Equitation competition is offered for junior and amateur riders and is judged based on the style and form of the rider. Horses are not judged in this discipline, but successful riders will ensure that their horses are well behaved. Riders can be judged over fences or on the flat.



DECCACE

DRESSAGE

Dressage is a competitive equestrian sport, defined by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) as "the highest expression of horse training." The rider will be relaxed and appear effort-free while the horse willingly performs the requested movement. In modern dressage competition, successful training at the various levels is demonstrated through the performance of "tests," prescribed series of movements ridden within a standard arena. Dressage is considered the most artistic of the equestrian sports and can be traced back centuries. The Freestyle is choreographed and performed to music.



POLO

To get the most out of polo, it helps to understand the basics of the game. The polo field is 300 yards long by 160 yards wide (the area of nine football fields). Two teams, each with four players, compete. The game is divided into six 7-minute, 30-second play periods called "chukkers." The objective is to drive the ball downfield and between the opponent's goalposts. The team that scores the most goals wins.

DANIELLE GOLDSTEIN-WALDMAN Exemplifies Girl Power in Exceptional Year

Life-changing doesn't seem like an adequate word to describe the year that Danielle (Dani) Goldstein, now Goldstein-Waldman, had in 2019. Not only did she repeat her WEF 7 victory in the \$391,000 Palm Beach Equine Clinic Grand Prix CSI 5* during the Winter Equestrian Festival, she was also victorious in the Shanghai Longines Global Champions Tour (LGCT) Grand Prix in May and the Berlin LGCT Grand Prix in July. Adding to her victories, the athlete finally married long-time partner and fellow horseman, Alan Waldman, at the end of May.

"It's been an absolutely incredible year," she said. "I was thrilled with the win in Shanghai because that was something I worked towards for months and really wanted."

Dani was the first female rider to earn top podium honors at the Shanghai event and also qualified

herself for the LGCT Super Grand Prix in Prague. She then surprised herself by sealing another victory in Berlin only a few months later.

"I went to Berlin primarily for my GCL

team, and I wasn't even aiming for a win in the grand prix, but she felt in incredible form so we gave it a shot and it just worked out," she remembered.

As for her International grand prix success, Dani credits her unique partnership with the 13-year-old British-bred mare, LizzieMary, which she hopes to take with her to the Olympic arena this summer in Tokyo.

"I wish I had a good answer as to why we work so well together, but some partnerships just click right off the

bat," Dani explained. "Alan was sent a video from Dan Walsh, and we immediately flew to England to try her.

"We jumped very few jumps with her, but we pretty much knew right away," she continued. "It's really rather magical; everything about her suits my riding style and everything about my riding suits her. We have built up a lot of trust with one another."

Dani and Alan are no strangers to the business of buying, selling, and breeding top sport horses. Together, the pair owns hundreds of hunter/jumpers and young horses and are based in Holland. The two strongly rely on one another's instincts about horses and share a deep passion for their industry.

"It's one thing to trust your own gut, but to have that decision seconded by someone whose opinion you really trust is really special and important," said Dani. "Alan has developed and found so many horses for the top level sport that I trust his opinion implicitly; it's amazing to have someone like that to bounce ideas off of."

Dani focuses on competing at the top level of the sport and spends many hours on the road dominating horse shows across the United States and Europe, while Waldman continues to build strong bloodlines and produce top contenders at five-star events and championships.

"Alan really loves the breeding, but I'm gone so much that sometimes I'll come back and I don't even know what horses we have in the barn. I mean, between the two of us we have over 600 horses," Dani laughed.
"When I first moved to Europe, I didn't have that much
of an interest in breeding, but now that I have been
around it for a while, I'm really able to see how much of
the talent and potential comes down to the bloodlines."

While her plans for the winter circuit are not set in stone, Dani has scheduled another season of WEF into her books. She plans to still compete in several indoor shows in Europe at the beginning of the winter but works to arrange her schedule perfectly with emphasis on the WEF 7 five-star grand prix and the Nations Cup CSIO week.

"I'm pre-qualified for the week seven grand prix because of the win last year so that's a goal, and now that team Israel is qualified for the Olympics, we are aiming to do several Nations Cup events together as practice, including the one in Wellington," she confirmed.

When not in the midst of competition, Dani said she is most looking forward to the social life she enjoys exclusively during her time spent in Wellington.

"One thing I get to do in Wellington that I typically don't embark on at home is socialize," she emphasized. "When I'm in Florida there's not a day or night that I spend alone because I'm trying to get in as much time as possible with friends that are often too far away for me to see in Europe."





SLOANE COLES Riding Her Own Path

Sloane Coles is living every young rider's dream. It's a somewhat universal bucket list—to start out on the ponies and junior hunters, get good experience in the junior jumpers, finish your junior career with top ribbons on every major equitation final, move from the junior jumper ranks to working for top riders, then compete in grand prix classes and make a U.S. Nations Cup team.

Sloane has checked every one of those goals off her to-do list, and it's all a result of hard work and making the most of opportunities that came her way. In September 2019, the pieces all came together, and she jumped in her first U.S. senior Nations Cup when she donned a team "pinque" coat and rode Chippendale's Boy DZ in the Spruce Meadows 'Masters' Nations Cup CSIO5*. Sloane will be one to keep an eye on in the Winter Equestrian Festival grand prix classes this winter.

"During every lesson as a junior and every big event, I was always told, 'All of this preparation is for the moment when you're in a Nations Cup representing your country," said Sloane. "I was so surprised with how at ease I felt when I finally rode on the team. I have no doubt that it's because it was engrained in me from the beginning. I was always told that if I wanted to be a team rider, I was going to have to ride with an extra level of fight, and I feel like I did."

Sloane grew up in the heart of Virginia horse country in The Plains. Her father, John, is a former steeplechase jockey and currently serves as Joint Master of Fox Hounds for the prestigious Orange County Hounds foxhunt. Her mother, Julie, is an accomplished hunter and jumper competitor in her own right and also foxhunts. With parents like hers, Sloane was born into equestrian sport with no doubt that the back of a horse is where she belongs.

Sloane enjoyed a successful career as a junior, winning equitation, hunter, and show jumping titles at top shows throughout North America, while also consciously preparing for an opportunity to ride for her country one day. Her riding is the product of influences from many prominent trainers she's worked with, including Johnny and Kitty Barker, John and Beezie Madden, Stacia Madden, and Andre Dignelli.

Sloane attended college at Drew University, pursuing a degree in sociology and business and training with

Mark Leone. She graduated in 2011 and decided to expand her horizons by working for the top Belgian trainer and dealer Francois Mathy. She returned home and started her Springledge LLC in 2013.

Life changed for Sloane when Chippendale's Boy DZ joined her string. "We found him in the north of Holland from Tonny Leeuwen, and he had only competed up to 1.40m," said Sloane of the 10-year-old Zangersheide gelding she decided to take a chance on by buying herself a year ago. "No one believed he would turn out to be much."

According to Sloane, "Chip" has always had an amazing jump with carefulness and scope to spare, but his rideability required significant work on her part. Sloane took a step back and focused on her flatwork before asking him to step up a level.

"We even spent a lot of time trail riding in a rope halter so he could stop and eat grass whenever he wanted," she said. "That has become his favorite activity, but now every time I ask him to do something new, he is always there, ready to master it."

Sloane and Chip are based out of her own Springledge LLC in The Plains, VA, where her family also operates a retirement program caring for more than 50 horses.

"I feel very lucky to do what I do, but also to have the horse I have," said Sloane, who is hopeful that she and Chip will soon find themselves representing the U.S. again. "I know horses like him and opportunities like I have had recently are hard to come by, but I really feel like Chip is a championship horse and we are both ready to make names for ourselves at this level together."







Furthermore, since 2001 Rolex has been Title Sponsor of the Rolex IJRC Top 10 Final, which is contested by the 10 highest-ranked riders in the world and is organized by the International Jumping Riders Club (IJRC).

EVENTING

In eventing, Rolex is Official Timepiece of three legendary competitions: the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event (United States), the Mitsubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials and the Land Rover Burghley Horse Trials (both United Kingdom). Together, these events make up the Rolex Grand Slam of Eventing, an award presented to the rider who, consecutively, wins these competitions. Since its creation in 2001, the Grand Slam has only been won twice.

ROLEX TESTIMONEES

Rolex's presence in equestrianism is cemented by close associations with the world's most talented riders. These exceptional athletes have won the premier competitions and claimed medals at World Cups, European Championships and Olympic Games.

The family of Rolex Testimonees in show jumping includes: Scott Brash from the United Kingdom, to date the first and only winner of the Rolex Grand Slam of Show Jumping; Germany's Meredith Michaels-Beerbaum; Brazilian Rodrigo Pessoa; Canada's Eric Lamaze; French rider Kevin Staut; Steve Guerdat and Martin Fuchs from Switzerland; Bertram Allen from Ireland; Kent Farrington from the United States; Jeroen Dubbeldam from the Netherlands; and, more recently, Harry Charles, a promising young British rider who was part of the Young Riders Academy Class of 2018.

Rolex also supports British equestrian Zara Tindall in eventing, as well as Rolex Testimonee Isabell Werth in dressage.

BEHIND THE SCENES

Behind the scenes, Rolex partners the International Jumping Riders Club (IJRC), a group comprised of the top-ranked riders, which promotes the image of show jumping and organizes the Rolex IJRC Top 10 Final. In 2014, Rolex began a partnership with the Young Riders Academy, developed by equestrian professionals with the cooperation of the IJRC to help support the next generation of riders.

AN AFFINITY WITH EXCELLENCE

The roots of Rolex's affinity for elite sports and human achievement can be traced back to the pioneering origins of the company. When founder Hans Wilsdorf set up his watchmaking firm, he was influenced by the swift changes sweeping through society at the beginning of the 20th century. To prove his invention, Hans Wilsdorf equipped a young English swimmer, Mercedes Gleitze, with an Oyster when she swam the English Channel a year later in 1927. The Rolex watch emerged from more than 10 hours in the water in perfect working condition, and Gleitze effectively became the first Rolex Testimonee, a witness to the watch's unwavering performance.

Rolex continued to use the world as a real-life proving ground for the Oyster, demonstrating time and again its reliability in the most extreme conditions, on land, in the air, in the depths of the ocean or on the tallest peaks. These exploits helped to develop Rolex watches, such as the Oyster Perpetual Explorer and Explorer II, the Cosmograph Daytona, the Submariner and the Yacht-Master. This commitment to superior performance and to innovation extended to the realm of sporting excellence, where Rolex is a leading and trusted partner.

Rolex has built upon its passion for watchmaking to embrace the rich heritage of equestrianism. The brand's trailblazing spirit and exacting standards are shared with the sport's foremost events and riders worldwide.





HERMÈS VIVACE SADDLE

Heir to the Steinkraus saddle, the Hermès Vivace jumping saddle offers an unparalleled sensation of closeness between horse and rider, combined with optimum comfort.

Several technical innovations, such as the refined blocks and flat panels, have eliminated superfluous thicknesses and pressure points.

The seat and knee rolls in calfskin ensure a high level of comfort. Entirely made to measure, the Hermès Vivace saddle combines an enhanced centre of gravity with exemplary stability and perfect balance.

Three questions for Laurent Goblet, master saddler at Hermès, who designed the new Hermès Vivace jumping saddle.

What new features does the Hermès Vivace saddle bring to the history of Hermès saddles?

We already have several models for jumping, including the Hermès Cavale saddle for seated riding and the Hermès Allegro for a suspended position. For the Hermès Vivace, we wanted to offer an alternative for riders who favour the two-point position, in which the rider's weight is supported by their thighs,

keeping their knees in contact with the saddle. When I design a new saddle, I always improve the existing models by removing anything that has become superfluous and perfecting their strong points. Saddlery is a métier requiring innovation and expertise, and we are on constant quest for improvement without ever renouncing the past. When I arrived at Hermès in 1977, an extraflat and light saddle called the Steinkraus was revolutionizing riding. When evoking its qualities, the term "close contact" came to mind. For the Hermès Vivace saddle I have interpreted the famous close contact through three key words: closeness, stability and comfort.

How are these qualities reflected in the Hermès Vivace saddle?

Closeness depends on the saddle's ergonomics, which must allow the rider maximum contact with the horse. So we remodelled the curves of the tree and reduced its width. Then we removed superfluous thickness by opting for finer materials and by arranging the pieces so that they fit together without overlapping. For stability, we have redesigned the balance of the saddle by changing the straps. They are no longer straight but slanted, forming a V so as to spread out the attachment points. The saddle thus remains very stable during the jump. For comfort, I have included a new, more supple and elastic type of foam.

What is the role of the partner riders in developing this new saddle?

It is pivotal. All the saddles conceived by Hermès are created in collaboration with partner riders. For the Hermès Vivace saddle we worked with the French rider Alexandra Paillot from the very first prototypes. We also consulted two other riders: Anne Kursinski and Daniel Bluman. All three particularly liked its balance and lightness, and the optimum contact it offers with the horse.

The balance is perfect. I don't know how to explain it, but it feels like being in an old saddle, even though it's new. I really appreciate the work done to eliminate all the unnecessary elements. Fewer blocks and panels give closer contact with the horse.

HIGHEST STAKES STAGE

Cutting-edge technologies bring biomechanical expertise to the super-size task of rebuilding the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center's International Arena.

Car racing has the Daytona International Speedway. Tennis has Wimbledon's Centre Court. Equestrian sports have the Winter Equestrian Festival's (WEF) International Arena. All three stages attract the eyes of the world and the characteristics of their competition surfaces influence who gets millions in prize money and the fame that comes with it.

Even higher stakes rest on the surface of the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center's (PBIEC) International Arena. Ground that's a tick too loose, too hard, too deep or too shallow anywhere on course — relative to each of the track's jumping challenges — could lead to a career-ending injury for an elite equine athlete. Huge investments of time, money and hope can evaporate with the slightest misstep – instantly making moot the loss of that day's prize money.

This being an Olympic year, the stakes are even higher and they apply to an unusually wide international field of contenders vying for qualifications. Quadrennial international competition years intensify the importance of preserving the horse's welfare while creating a riding surface with the stability and cushion needed for horses to jump confidently and at their peak.

With that mandate, PBIEC undertook a mission to completely re-envision and rebuild the International arena, from the bottom up. PBIEC systematically used state-of-the-art approaches and technologies at every step throughout the conceptualization, design and implementation. This would produce a fully engineered arena of the highest caliber, perhaps one of the very few in the world which has been so engineered.

Bring on the Robots

Stakeholders in highest level equestrian sports fully embrace the critical role of the surface upon which it unfurls. The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) leads the way in setting ever-higher standards for the safety and enhanced performance of its athletes. With arena surfaces, this involves cuttingedge research and technology: even robots!

The FEI recently enlisted the Objective

Biomechanical Surface Testing machine, aka the "OBST," to quantify the various forces of impact involved in takeoff, landing, galloping and turning. It measures the impact, cushion, responsiveness and grip, and the uniformity of those characteristics throughout the surface. In essence, it measures what the horse feels when it performs on a specific surface. It is used by the FEI after an arena has been built to certify it for 5* competition.

Equestrian Sport Productions' (ESP)

Palm Beach International Equestrian Center is closely following the FEI's lead regarding footing. The 12-week WEF series includes 11 weeks of FEI competition and four weeks of 5* level tournaments, during which horse/rider pairs from around the world will vie to represent their countries at the 2020 Olympics in July. Many of those contenders will likely first head from Wellington to the FEI World Cup Finals in Las Vegas, with expectations of being perfectly prepared by their WEF outings.

The high stakes of this year's WEF coincided with ESP already set to completely re-do the International Arena. Over a decade ago, WEF was the first American show organizer to mix footing textiles into arena sand. It was a big step forward for the PBIEC and for the sport because it was followed by venues throughout the country. Now, the bar for excellence and leadership is even higher. A comprehensively designed and fully engineered arena is that bar.

A Massive Undertaking

Hosting the hub of North American equestrian sport, the WEF organizers are accustomed to super-size challenges. However, this year's new International Arena required extra wide-ranging degrees of planning, research, testing and expertise.



ESP President Michael Stone explains: "Our research included where do we get the best sand, the best fibers to mix it with, and what's best to put between the footing surface and the drainage level." Those answers are influenced by the needs of its exhibitors, of course, but also by Wellington's weather and climate. ESP turned to horsemen, arena builders and footing experts from around the world for the right answers.

Each of the

components making up the arena layers have a necessary function (e.g., drainage, concussion relief, stability, etc.) and they all work together as a complete system. Bill Hawe's iEquiTek, LLC was enlisted to work with the design team to test and measure these components in the laboratory and in the field, separately and as a total system. Results were compared against competing components, other competition venues, surface performance, etc., to achieve the highest level of equestrian performance. iEquiTek's technology is optimized for such design support and arena construction, prior to FEI certification.

One critical component in the overall system is a concussion mat layer. Besides isolating the underlying drainage system, this provides stability, drainage pass-through, concussion relief and certain safety features. After testing four arena matting systems, OTTO Sport Base Mats from Germany emerged as the clear starting point for the International Arena. OTTO Sport mats have been used by top competitors throughout Europe for over 30 years and represented exclusively in North America by Premier Equestrian, Inc. since 2014. The 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, the 2010 World Equestrian Games at the Kentucky Horse Park and the renowned Aachen Equestrian Festival are among the 6,000 top arenas

worldwide to use OTTO Sport.

From the all-important horse's perspective, OTTO Sport Base Mats absorb 40% of the concussive force when the hoof hits the ground, while jumping or galloping between fences. Cutting that impact by 40% —



even before adding the cushion of the footing blend atop the base — means substantially cutting down wear and tear on the horse's joints. It's often said that every horse has only so many jumps in its body. OTTO Sport makes it possible to get the most from each jumping effort and hoof-fall.

Remarkable drainage capacity is another unique OTTO Sport advantage – up to eight inches per hour. Dressage Olympian Steffen Peters and his wife Shannon witnessed this first-hand in 2015, when California's El Niño rains flooded much of their stable property. They were able to ride through it thanks to their newly installed OTTO Sport Base Mats and ProTex footing blend from Premier Equestrian, a big boost to Steffen's successful bid for a fifth Olympic appearance. Wellington's often wild weather should be no match for the new International Arena, enabling competitors to safely keep their horses in form.

Take A Beach Walk

Equestrian Sport Productions gave equal attention to choosing the ideal top-layer footing. As an OTTO Sport expert, Premier Equestrian was a natural choice for its extensive experience and success in pairing the base with the ideal high-performance footing blend.

For the International Arena, ESP chose ProTex Arena Footing blend specifically to suit the silica sand selected by Bart Poels and Travis Gould of JTWG, Inc. The type, source, size and shape of sand varies widely in how it affects a riding surface. Geologists and soil engineers know there are approximately 10,000 different types of sand in the United States, because selecting the right sand is critical to the safe construction and longevity of most of the country's

infrastructure.
Equestrians don't

The simplest explanation is found on a beach walk, shares Premier Equestrian's President Heidi Zorn. Near the

waterline, wet compacted sand provides traction but little cushion. Higher up, it's loose sand that provides ample cushion, but little traction and stability and it's laborious to walk or run in.

iEquiTek's engineering support capabilities were brought in again to conceive and measure a variety of customized footing mixes. Each mix had important and subtle performance advantages, each improving on the prior to achieve specific performance and maintenance results. This created a knowledge base where grip, firmness, cushion, rebound timing, drainage capability, water holding capability, etc. were all "tuning parameters" which could be adjusted and ultimately optimized to produce the final proprietary and fully customized footing mix for the International arena.

The silica sands selected for the International Arena were sourced and trucked in from over 1,000 miles away specifically to meet the FEI's standards for hosting the top-flight 5* jumping competition, as must all components of the ring's footing.

Introduced in 2016, Premier ProTex Arena Footing is designed for high performance in high use areas. A proprietary ratio mix of textile and fibers is blended with the sand to create stability, cushion, rebound and grip, all characteristics the FEI is looking for as the horse's top priorities. The end result is a surface that mimics the feel and function of grass. This includes a "rooting" function ProTex brings by reducing shear force and promoting shock absorption.

Cleanliness and consistency are additional ProTex attributes. Premier Equestrian's fibers and textiles do not contain anything from the "post-consumer waste stream," Zorn explains. Protecting horse's

health goes well beyond soundness and career longevity, she says of Premier Equestrian's policy on this little-discussed detail involved in arena footing. Further, ProTex is chopped and blended in a consistent manner, then shipped in a protective all-weather pallet to arrive as clean as it was when packaged.

Now celebrating its 20th year, Premier Equestrian earned its "Experts in Equestrian Surfaces" motto the hard way: research, formulating and sometimes re-formulating footing blends, testing, and, ultimately, riding. Zorn is an active dressage competitor and Premier staff members also speak from daily experience riding, competing and, most of all, caring for their own horses.


Possible By Partnerships

Partnerships have been critical to the success of the International Arena installation. Working out of Premier Equestrian's new branch office in Florida, CEO Mark Neihart was onsite, working with FEI footing consultant Bart Poels, local arena builder Travis Gould of JTWG, Inc., and Bill Hawe's company, iEquiTek. "The International Arena is now one of the very few in the world that

has been completely engineered to meet specific performance and maintenance objectives," Hawe comments. "All the way from the bottom up to the riding surface." In short, it represents a new era of data-defined riding surfaces that are designed to meet specific performance criteria.

It's been a massive undertaking. The International Arena, including the warm-up and walk-way, incorporates 132,000 square feet of riding surface. In September, Gould and his JTWG team began removing the material – some of which were recycled to refresh other arenas – and started from scratch on the drainage system below the OTTO Sport Base Mats.

Although enormous in scope and its sport-wide impact, the PBIEC International Arena's installation shares a raison d'etre with Premier Equestrian's wide-ranging installations of all sizes around the country. "There are only so many competitions your horse can do in his career," Zorn notes. "Make sure you are not jeopardizing his performance on dangerous footing and choose competitions that provide safe footing surfaces, such as ESP's Winter Equestrian Festival."



MANAGING JOINT DISEASE

at Every Stage of Life Because Mobility is Longevity

Regardless of discipline, the demands of performance take a toll on your horse's joints.

Degenerative joint disease (DJD) can occur within any joint that consistently undergoes wear and tear, known as "use trauma." ²



"This season is imperative, as it delivers opportunities for competitors seeking out World Cup qualification, as well as Olympic and Paralympic preparation. This year, the CDI 5* serves as a mandatory outing for the U.S. dressage riders striving for team placement; a group of Japanese competitors will make the journey to work toward Tokyo 2020; and a CDI-W has been added into the last week of competition as a final

opportunity for riders contending for FEI World Cup Finals. The 2020 AGDF will also strategically host two CPEDIs in January, as a way to accommodate athletes looking to achieve scores before Paralympic qualification ends."

As Baur explained, the season serves as a strong competition scene for riders seeking to gain more experience with their mounts, and 2019 Pan American Games team silver medalist Jennifer Baumert (USA) credited the show for allowing her to do just that in years past. "AGDF is one of my favorite horse shows," she said. "As a true pinnacle of dressage in the United States, the people, the atmosphere, the international flair all make it an incredible place to bring your horses to, to prepare them."

"I think it's incredibly beneficial to have this circuit," Baumert continued. "It has really put the US on that international stage. The fact that we can attract so many riders from other nations is a major accomplishment, and a big deal for our sport."

The incoming lineup features four CDI-Ws, one CDI 4* and CDI 5*, as well as a CDIO 3* and two CPEDI competitions. The invigorating "Friday Night Stars" will return as a season staple, highlighting the iconic FEI Grand Prix Freestyle, and national classes will run parallel throughout all ten weeks. The inaugural Lövsta Future Challenge for Young Grand Prix Horses (8 to 10-year-olds) will kick off this year, serving as the next step for horses returning after 2019's Prix St. Georges Future Challenge, and eDressage will also make its debut in the national and CPEDI arenas this year, too.

The 2020 season kicks off on January 8-12, featuring the first of four CDI-W competitions, as well as the first CPEDI 3* and national show of the season. AGDF 3 will follow (Jan. 22-26) with the same schedule, welcoming CDI-W, CPEDI 3*, and national competitors to the arenas at Equestrian Village. The circuit resumes for AGDF 5 (Feb. 5-9) and will host its third CDI-W of the year, as well as continued national events in the rings adjoining the Global Arena. AGDF 6 (Feb 14-16) hosts national competition.

AGDF 7 (Feb 19-23) promises a star-studded spectacular, as competitors from all over the globe go head-to-head competing at the highest caliber in the CDI 5*. The 5* will also host a new ticket giveaway. providing the opportunity for lucky fans to win tickets for the FEI World Cup Finals in Las Vegas this April. The CDI 4* and national levels promise another competitive week during AGDF 8 (Feb 26- Mar 1) and will coincide with the ever-popular Palm Beach Derby, which serves as a tradition in the South Florida dressage community, as well as the Florida International Youth Dressage Championships. The popular Challenge of the Americas takes center stage for AGDF's week 9 (Mar 6-8), and international competition resumes on March 10 with AGDF 10. a national show and the CDIO3*. Week 11 (Mar. 20-22) welcomes more national competitors to PBIEC.

The finale of the AGDF season includes the final CDI-W of the 2020 season, and the final chance for riders to achieve qualification for the FEI Dressage World Cup Final.

"We are grateful to have been on this journey from its inception," concluded Allyn Mann, Director of Strategic Partnerships at American Regent Animal Health (formerly Luitpold Pharmaceuticals, Inc.), makers' of Adequan® i.m. (polysulfated Glycosaminoglycan). "It is nice to see that AGDF continues to attract a varied audience of riders and horses, giving everyone the chance to ride down the center line. Wishing everyone continued success!"





For amateur hunter competitor and judge, Page Tredennick, the year has been full of new experiences in the horse industry. While she enjoys competing across the country and has been judging at various shows for multiple years, Tredennick has recently stepped into yet another position as owner of Carlchen W, an 11-year-old Mecklenburg gelding ridden by Alex Granato. The pair had an amazing 2019 season, with five FEI wins including the FEI Jumping World Cup Wellington. They made their championship debut, helping the United States win the team bronze medal at the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru.

"I've had an amazing year, but my biggest highlight would definitely be the Pan Am Games," she said. "To see my horse do so well and make it to a championship like that was an incredible experience." She credits much of their success to the relationship the pair have created.

"Alex is a wonderful rider and horseman, and while

he doesn't have a multitude of horses to ride, he has created a true partnership with Carlchen W that has taken them much further than I ever could have hoped," she said.

When not touring championships with the special duo, Tredennick maintains and competes several of her own horses in the amateur hunter divisions. She had a successful summer at the Tryon International Equestrian Center with mounts Tomcat and Apricot Lane and will spend the winter competing in Wellington and cheering on her star team.

"I'm really looking forward to see what Alex and Carlchen accomplish this winter," she added, "I definitely still enjoy the riding aspect but it has been an exciting experience to be involved in the career of such a great horse and something I may get more involved in going forward."

During the 2019 Winter Equestrian Festival, we caught up with Ariel Bluman about her and husband Daniel's hopes for the Israeli Olympic team, horse show life with a new baby, and more. We checked in with Ariel about her upcoming return to WEF and what the year had in store. It turns out the couple will be welcoming another bouncing baby Bluman boy in January, but she has hopes that she will make it back into the show ring before the end of season.

"We will be having another baby at the end of January but I'm hoping by March I'll be riding and back in the ring a bit," Bluman explained. "When I had my first baby, I stopped exercising as much because I had some symptoms and it made it a lot harder to get fit back for the ring, so this time I'm trying to stay as active as possible throughout the pregnancy to make the recovery easier."


While he will compete as many weekends as his schedule allows, Wolf makes a point to be present in Wellington for as much of Hunter Week as possible.



"Those two mares are definitely my favorite in the barn because they both have a lot of personality," she laughed.

"When Annie (HH Azur) returned to win last year's Rolex Grand Prix, it was a great moment for all of us," she continued. "She had been injured, and even with a full recovery you never know if they will fully return to what they had been before."

She described the atmosphere that night as comparable to no other. "It is the last grand prix event of circuit, so the crowd is unbelievable for this special class. It is always packed, and people are cheering and having a great time. McLain and Annie making their return victory in that event is



one of the best memories I have," she said.

While the 2020 Winter Equestrian Festival will be her 12th season and is a 12-week event, Virginie, who is originally from France, says she always looks forward to her winters in South Florida.

"I would not want to spend my winters anywhere else," she confirmed. "I love the equestrian community there because everything is so convenient and accessible."

Most of all, she enjoys getting to spend each night in her own bed and each day with her entire team of co-workers, riders and equestrian athletes.

"Usually when we travel to shows you are gone most of the week with a couple of horses leaving other team members behind," she explained. "At WEF, almost all of the team is there working hard together every single day and sharing in losses and successes, which I think makes us stronger as a team."

If charged with the idea of ever changing her lifestyle, Virginie considered opening a rescue ranch in Montana, but she says she truly can't imagine a better career than she has now.

"Castle Hill is, in my opinion, one of the best in the business. Lee and Erica have produced a flawless system and program and they are just incredible people," she said. "I hope they keep me around for many more years because it is truly my dream job!"



Mom Lisa Deslauriers, who also competed at the top international level, was there cheering on both sides.

"There was definitely an element of, 'Wow, I can't believe this is happening,' " commented Lucy.





"Obviously it was an epic career highlight because not only did I get to experience my first championship, but I got to compete there with my dad as well."

"It was nerve-wracking," added Lisa Deslauriers, about watching her husband and daughter compete against each other

in the same event. "It's always special to be on any team representing your country, and to have all of us there as a family, including our son Jack, was a truly special moment."

"It's always fun to be competing with or against your daughter," Mario continued. "We've done quite a few Nations Cups already where we have competed against each other, but it's exciting for the family."

Lucy maintains that despite the fact that the two were on opposing teams, any rivalry that occurs is all play.

"It's always fun for me to say I beat him or for him to say he beat me, but at the end of the day it's a family win and that's what matters," she said.

"We like to be together as a family, so I don't want to say it's cushy or it isn't hard to always make everything work, but we're very lucky that the four of us have a common interest," Lisa detailed. "Even though Jack doesn't ride anymore, he still has a strong interest in the horse sport, and he is involved with a lot of the back office end of it. I guess some families need their space, but for us it's been one thing that has kept us together."

As a family, even outside of the horses, the Deslauriers have always made an effort to enjoy various activities together. According to Lucy, she and her brother were both introduced to riding, but also enjoyed other sports such as basketball, soccer, and tennis.

The youngest Deslauriers is currently majoring in Healthcare Marketing and Finance at Penn State University as her parents have always put a strong emphasis on balancing education and the equestrian sport.



WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Stars from the Spy Coast Farm Developing Jumpers Make Good on Early Promise

ARMANI SL Z (Successful in Spy Coast Farm Developing Jumper classes at each age, winner in the Spy Coast Farm Young Horse Show Series at three and four years old)

Armani SL Z (Asca Z x Cumano) is probably one of the best performing horses that has ever competed in young jumper competitions at WEF. With the 23-year-old Mexican rider Eugenio Garza in the irons, the beautiful grey gelding with one blue eye has a record to be proud of. Last summer the now 12-yearold gelding jumped at the Pan American Games in Lima, Peru, and performed incredibly well with a silver medal in the team competition and a sixth place finish individually. Three weeks later, Garza and Armani continued their successes at the CSI 4* in St. Tropez, France, by winning the grand prix qualifier and finishing second in the Grand Prix. Earlier in 2019. Garza and Armani were runner up in the CSI 5* Grand Prix in Langley, BC, and in the CSI 3* Grand Prix in Lexington, KY, in addition to multiple top placings at the highest level of the sport.

As a young horse, Armani SL Z already stood out with his outstanding jumping abilities. In 2011, as a three-year-old, he won both the In-Hand and Loose Jumping divisions in the final of the Spy Coast Farm Young Horse Show Series at PBIEC and as a four-year-old, he was the Jumping Under Saddle champion in the same competition. In one of the events leading up to the 2011, final he even got awarded the "perfect 10" for jumping style and the judge

commented that Armani had "top FEI potential." In the years that followed, Armani competed successfully in the Young Jumper divisions (now called Developing Jumpers) at WEF as a five-, sixand seven-year-old under Ezequiel Peralta. After that he was sold to Eugenio Garza's parents, David and Monica.

"Armani is the result of our trip to the World Breeding Jumping Championships for Young Horses in Lanaken, Belgium, for which we qualified in 2008 with our six-year-old Carambo Z, owned by the Bakker family," said Wendy Peralta of Seabreeze Farm. "Armani was still with his mother at that time, but we were smitten by his cresty neck, his blue eye, and his Cumano-bred mother. The Bakker family purchased Armani, he was weaned, and the rest is history."

Peralta really believes that the Developing Jumper divisions are beneficial in the development of the young equine athletes. "When you reflect back on those years when Armani did the competitions, then you realize how special it was to be able to showcase a young horse in that atmosphere," she said.

His co-breeder Roelof Bril from the Netherlands was a successful international show jumping rider himself and he knew that if he wanted to breed a successful show jumper, he had to start with a mother that had proven successful herself. So he paired his mare Beat Me, who herself had jumped up to 1.50m-international level, with the Belgian stallion Toulon, who competed at the international 1.60m level.

F One USA was born and as a three-vear-old stallion, was approved for the KWPN, the Royal Dutch Warmblood Studbook. Poden Farm from Great Britain bought F One USA and with their excellent care, fantastic management, and the top riders they hired to develop their young talent, F One USA got all the chances to develop into a promising show jumper. And he didn't disappoint. In 2016 F One USA was circuit champion of the then-named Adequan Six-Year-Old Young Jumper division at WEF under Olympic Champion Nick Skelton (GBR). Another world-class rider and Olympic Champion, Ben Maher (GBR), took over the reins and last summer, as a nine-year-old, F One USA jumped at the biggest five-star shows in Europe like Aachen CHIO in Germany and the Global Champions League events in London, Paris, Monte Carlo, Madrid, and Rome.



MANHATTAN (2017 Spy Coast Farm Six-Year-Old Developing Jumper Circuit Champion)

For Georgina Bloomberg's Gotham Enterprizes, the circuit championship for Manhattan in the 2017 Spy Coast Farm Six-Year-Old Developing Jumper division was a very special one. Not only was Gotham Enterprizes the owner of Manhattan, the New York and Wellington-based operation is also the breeder of the chestnut gelding and Bloomberg has ridden Manhattan's French-bred father Metropolitan (by Cabdula du Tillard) as well as his German-bred mother Lumina 2 (by Lancer III) at the highest level. Between 2005-2010, she rode Metropolitan and Lumina to four WEF Challenge Cup victories. Last summer, as an eight-year-old, Manhattan showed successfully in Europe at the two-star level with Irish rider Jeremy Sweetnam and later in the season with Bloomberg herself.



ORBETELLO (2011 Adequan Eight-Year-Old Young Jumper Circuit Champion)

In 2011, Olympian Margie Engle rode her own Orbetello to the circuit championship in the Eight-Year-Old Developing Jumper division, but the success of the bay stallion didn't stop there. Orbetello went on to compete at the highest international level with three different riders. In 2015, the then 12-year-old stallion jumped to no less than 10 top-10 finishes at the international four- and five-star competitions at Spruce Meadows with U.S. show jumper Brianne Goutal. He even won a class at five-star level and finished sixth in a demanding five-star Grand Prix.

The well-bred Orbetello has in Orlando van de Heffinck one of the best Belgian breeding stallions as his father. His mother, Landkind, is a daughter of one of the most famous German stallions of all time, Landgraf I. His pedigree and own accomplishments in the sport combined was reason enough for several European studbooks to add Orbetello to their list of approved breeding stallions.

TUPAC VAN DE VROMBAUTSHOEVE (2017 Spy Coast Farm Seven-Year-Old Developing Jumper Circuit Champion)

Over the summer of 2019, the now 10-year-old Tupac van de Vrombautshoeve showed that his circuit championship in the in 2017 Spy Coast Farm Seven-Year-Old Developing Jumper division wasn't just a lucky one. The Zangersheide-bred gelding has the same sire as McLain Ward's championship horse HH Azur (Thunder van de Zuuthoeve) and won the 2017 championship under Emanuel Andrade from Venezuela. Last year Tupac, currently owned by Oakmont Stables LLC, further developed into an international competitor under American show jumper Hardin Towell. The combination performed well at four- and five-star level at Spruce Meadows and the Hampton Classic and finished fourth in the Grand Prix of the Great Lakes Equestrian Festival in Traverse City, Michigan.

LOOKING AHEAD TO TOKYO

The NetJets U.S. Show Jumping team has an important goal in 2020—the Tokyo Olympic Games. The Show Jumping competition in Tokyo will be held on August 4–8, with the Individual Final on August 5 and the Team Final on August 8. Equestrian competition will take place in the Equestrian Park, the venue that hosted equestrian competition at the 1964 Tokyo Olympic Games.

The U.S. Equestrian Team (USET) Foundation is the philanthropic partner of US Equestrian (USEF) and works to make the dreams of competing on a U.S. team possible. Since 2004, the USET Foundation has awarded more than \$42 million in grants to support US Equestrian's High Performance programs, which include elite and developing international high performance athletes and horses, by offsetting the costs of competition, training, coaching, travel, and education. The USET Foundation will play a vital role in enabling U.S. horses and athletes to excel at the 2020 Tokyo

Olympic Games with its comprehensive campaign, "Raising The Bar."

The NetJets U.S. Show Jumping Team jumped to team silver at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games, team gold at the FEI World Equestrian Games™ Tryon 2018, then claimed team and individual bronze at the 2019 Pan American Games in Lima, Peru.

During his tenure as U.S. show jumping chef d'equipe since 2013, Robert Ridland has prioritized getting young talent some valuable team experience. He believes that doing so will build the depth of the pool of talent from which U.S. show jumping can draw when fielding future teams. Younger athletes have been participating on Nations

The strategy paid off in Lima for the 2019 Pan American Games, as the U.S. team included three riders competing in their first international championship and claimed the team

bronze. The veteran team anchor Beezie Madden, who also claimed individual bronze, was the only one with team championship experience with appearances at four Olympic Games and three World Equestrian Games (WEG). Alex Granato (34), Lucy Deslauriers (20), and Eve Jobs (21) not only excelled at their first major international championship, but also got to experience the pride of stepping atop the podium to collect a team medal for the United States.

For Ridland, it was a sign that his philosophy of giving young athletes valuable team experience is paying off. "This year's championships, the Pan Am Games, we were fortunate in having qualified for the Olympic Games the previous year through winning the WEG," he said. "That allowed us to do what we've tried to do so much, and that's have the younger generation of athletes be part of a championships. A medal was our goal going in, and we were fortunate to do that.

"Two of those athletes were not just in their 20s; they were literally just 20 and 21 years old. Alex was new to championships as well. We really only had one veteran rider, and that was Beezie, who double-medaled," he noted. "Obviously, we would have loved to have won gold, but our main focus is a medal. And we came home with two of them."

The Olympic Games in Tokyo will be the debut of a new championship format, with just threeathlete teams and no drop score for the team




competition. In addition, the individual medals will be decided before the team competition. "I think there's a little bit of an unknown for all of us who are heading up teams for Tokyo," Ridland said. "We have one less athlete on the field of play and no discard score, so on paper, consistency and reliability are going to be more of a priority than it has been in any previous championship."

The US Equestrian selection process for the Tokyo show jumping team will involve a short list of 10 athletes and horses, which will be finalized in April after the Winter Equestrian Festival season.. The short-listed athletes and horses will then compete at designated events and be observed by Ridland and a panel of Advisors, who will recommend three athlete/horse combinations and one alternate for the Individual and Team Competitions. "It's open to everybody who is possibly going to give us the best chance," Ridland said. "I think going into it, we have good depth."

The new format will change the dynamics of the competition, but the priority remains to field the best team possible. "There are so many countries that really have three top athletes. It's going to be tougher than ever," Ridland said. "Sometimes luck doesn't go your way, but on paper we've got some of the best top professional athletes in the business. There's no question about that. Our next generation of riders has been proving themselves well over the last few years, so I'm hoping our depth serves us well going forward."

The hype is real. The food is great! Farm Stand takes their stand with a commitment to quality ingredients, healthy options and a pristine environment.

Its own oasis neighboring Pony Island, more and more jumpers and show goers up top are making their way to the other side of the show grounds for a taste. While Saturdays and Sundays often have a lunchtime rush, some of the magic lies in the down times that make for a quiet escape and a cult following.

WEF SPORT HORSE GRADUATES

Show Big Results in 2019

From one of the world's best breeding farms of show jumping horses in the north of Holland to the Winter Equestrian Capital of the World in the south of Florida, the relationship between the world-renowned VDL Stud and the Winter Equestrian Festival has proven to be a successful one. In the eight-year history of the WEF Sport Horse Auction, many VDL horses sold in the auction have risen to the top of the sport. And that's not only at the highest level of show jumping, but also in the hunter and equitation ring, with professional and amateur riders.

Janko van de Lageweg is one of three sons of the VDL family. He focuses on the U.S. market and the WEF Sport Horse Auction. "In our breeding operation, we aim for the best jumping quality, but we also want our horses to be rideable, honest,

and willing. So, we need modern, careful, and fast horses with blood and a good attitude. For the highest level of the sport you also need a lot of scope, for amateur riders you need horses that are forgiving, for the hunter ring you need a pretty horse with a beautiful technique. We try to have all these types of horses in our breeding operation so we can provide what the market needs."

Looking at the amount of VDL-bred horses showing all over the world and the accomplishments they have had, from the equitation ring to the Olympic Games and from the hunters to the high amateur jumpers, the VDL Stud has proven to be one of the world's main producers of quality show jumpers.

Here is a look at three WEF Sport Horse Auction graduates who stood out in 2019:

SKARA GLEN'S MACHU PICCHU

Last summer, Skara Glen's Machu Picchu (Silverstone x Matterhorn) finished second in the five-star grand prix in Tryon under his Irish rider Paul O'Shea and won a grand prix in Lexington, Kentucky. He and O'Shea represented Ireland in Nations Cups in Dublin and Sopot. At the FEI Jumping Nations Cup Final in Barcelona, Machu Picchu helped the Irish team qualify for the Olympic Games in Tokyo with a clear round in the final round. The now 13-year-old gelding was sold as a four-year-old in the auction of 2011 under the name Chester VDL.

"The main goal for Machu Picchu this year will be the Olympic Games in Tokyo," said O'Shea. "He will jump a bit at WEF and then go to Europe to try to prove in some Nations Cups that we have maintained our form so we can be on the team." The Olympics would be the second big championship for Machu Picchu after the FEI World Equestrian Games in Tryon in 2018.

"Santos Lamarca and Amanda Flint developed him after the auction, and we bought him when he was seven," O'Shea recalled. "He had been very successful with Amanda and looked to have a



fantastic mind, to be extremely careful, and to have a great attitude."

Machu Picchu didn't disappoint. "He wants to do everything he can to leave the jumps up. He is quite strong, but that comes from his big heart to do the right thing, so that's a good problem to have," laughed O'Shea. Skara Glen's Machu Picchu is currently owned by Patricia Hurter of Amber Hill Farm, Bonnie and Frank Cunniffe of Whipstick Farm, and Phyllis and Harry Agnew of the Machu Picchu Syndicate.



FARREL

Another successful jumper graduate is the 10-year-old Farrel (Cardento VDL x Stakkato), ridden by Daniel Coyle and owned by Lothlorien Farm. The Irishman rides many VDL-bred horses for his Canadian employer Ariel Grange. Farrel was sold in the WEF Sporthorse Auction of 2017 as a seven-year-old after finishing sixth at the World Championships for six-year-old Jumpers at Lanaken, Belgium, in the year prior to the auction.

"After we bought him, he immediately won the final of the seven-year-old jumpers at WEF," remembered Coyle. "Then we were pretty sure that we had a very good horse. After that, we just took one step at a time. He's such a small horse with a big heart, but he's just figured out how to jump bigger now without putting himself under too much stress."

Coyle's and Grange's patience has paid off. Farrel had a very successful season in 2019 with a win in the World Cup Qualifier in Langley, British Columbia, and more than 10 top-10 finishes at FElrated competitions. The sky seems to be the limit for this little super star.



DISCOVERY-O

And then there is Discovery-O (Douglas x Indoctro), the 12-year-old chestnut gelding who was sold as a four-year-old in the 2012 auction. Discovery-O had a great jumping career in the United States with Chrissy Serio. "Because of Discovery's talent and great mind, I could do some FEI classes," said Serio. "Discovery got me there. He is the most amazing horse I have ever ridden. He gives you a feeling



that you can jump anything. He tries hard, he is very careful, but if he needs to, he will take down a jump and keep going. That's very important to me because I have definitely missed on him.

"We may not have won everything, but he gave me the opportunity to get in that ring," added Serio.


After his jumping career with Serio, Discovery is currently leased out to junior rider Ellie Ferrigno. The pair is doing well in the jumper ring, but have also shown their aptitude in the equitation divisions. Although it was a one-time event, one of the pair's first big accomplishments was the win in the Platinum Performance/USEF Show Jumping Talent Search Finals East. Discovery and Ferrigno will continue their partnership in the jumper ring in 2020.

"I love VDL horses and the WEF Sport Horse Auction is awesome," said Serio. "It's fun, they bring nice horses over for different levels and goals, and I trust them. You get good quality from them, and they are honest about it; they tell you what you'll get."
