SANTIAGO LAMBRE STORMS TO NETJETS GRAND PRIX CSI2* WIN

Mexico's Santiago Lambre rode Cetano van Aspergem Z to a speedy victory in the \$73,000 NetJets Grand Prix CSI2* on Saturday, January 18, during "Saturday Night Lights" at the 2020 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) at Palm Beach International Equestrian Center in Wellington, FL.

Clears were hard to come by in the opening round set by course designer Oscar Soberon (USA). A tight time allowed was first bested by Lillie Keenan (USA) riding Fasther, a mount that lived up to its name and led the way. Keenan was joined by five more riders, setting the stage for a six-horse speed duel over the second round's short course.

Rails fell for both Keenan and fellow U.S. rider Todd Minikus, riding Calvalou, before U.S. team Olympic gold medalist McLain Ward set the pace on a clear round in 43.60 seconds aboard Jet Blue. His time. however, was quickly beat when Lambre and Cetano van Aspergem Z stopped the clock in 40.22 seconds.

"This horse is naturally fast," said Lambre of the horse he has been competing internationally for almost three years. "I tried to not lose my mind, and I tried to keep a good, nice rhythm. The horse, at this level, can be very fast, and tonight it was.

"I'll try to move up to the four star in two weeks, and then we'll have to see how it goes," continued Lambre of his plans for Cetano van Aspergem

Z, a 10-year-old Zangersheide gelding (Clinton x Ahorn Z). "This is the first year that I have five or six horses to compete, so I plan to jump every week, and I think I have competitive horses for it."

Ireland's Paul O'Shea and Canadian Olympic champion Eric Lamaze both took shots at Lambre's time but could not match his mount's impressive foot speed. Lamaze was closest to victory just fractions off the pace in 40.26 seconds and settled for second riding Idalville d'Esprit, owned by Torrey Pines Stables Inc. and Chris Stinett.

"It's opening night, and this is where you bring up the young horses and young riders," said Lamaze. "I think it's going to get a whole lot more exciting as we carry on too. Nevertheless, tonight ended up being a very good competition.

"The obstacles were hard to jump. It wasn't necessarily the height, but the way they were built," he continued. "It ended up with the right amount of clear. For me, it's a new horse. So I learn a little bit every day about him. This was the first time that I asked him to go fast, and I was quite happy with the result."

Ward's double-clear handed him and new mount Jet Blue the thirdplace ribbon for owner Portfolio Horses LLC. "I was thrilled: this was the second event that we've had Jet Blue at in the last month, and he's

EMILY WARD DOMINATES UNDER 25 COMPETITION AT WEF 2

Great Britain's Emily Ward made a splash in the Under 25 division at the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) by winning the \$25,000 Hermès Under 25 Grand Prix CSI2* riding Millioninmind on Sunday, January 19, at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center in Wellington, FL.

Fifty-five horses challenged Oscar Soberon's (USA) opening track with 19 returning for a deciding jump-off. After winning the Hermès Under 25 Welcome just a day earlier, Ward wasted no time in establishing herself as the one to beat this season. She and Millioninmind, owned by Steven Barnes, stopped the clock in a quick 35.99 seconds over secondplace finisher Sydney Shulman's (ISR), who finished in a time of 36.18 seconds riding Jill Shulman's Azilis du Mesnil.

'I've actually never competed in America before, but I am off to a great start," said Ward, 20, who rides for Canadian Tiffany Foster's Little Creek Equestrian. "We've owned Millioninmind since he was six years old, so we've had him quite a long time. He took me on my first senior Nations Cup team, and won my first international

grand prix with me. Now, he has come over here and flourished.

"He's super careful, so these types of classes are perfect for him," said Ward of Millioninmind, a 12-year-old Irish Sporthorse gelding by ARD VDL Douglas. "He loves to go fast, and he's always looking for the next jump. I jumped the first line [in the jump-off] on the five, and then I had a really good shot back to b and c of what was the triple combination. [Millioninmind] knows exactly what he's doing, and that's where I knew I won it."

Fractions of a second off the win, Shulman's top finish was an early birthday present to herself before turning 25 on Monday. She hails from Greenwich, CT, and rides for Israel with seven years of experience in the under 25 division.

"It's an amazing division, and I am very grateful to Hermès for sponsoring it," she said. "It's a great stepping stone for riders like me. When I was younger coming up, and I couldn't do FEI legally, it was great to get my feet wet in FEI competitions. The horse I did today [Azilis du Mesnil], I bought her a little less than a year ago, and she's so competitive. She was a little bit green when I got her, but all she wants to do is jump the jumps and go fast."

Rounding out the top three, Catherine Wachtell (USA) finished third aboard Coverboy, owned by Autumn View Farm, in a time of 36.71 seconds. The 24-year-old rider hails from Chatham, NJ, and is in her second year of law school at Fordham University in New York, NY.

"The course really tested rideability, and my horse and I have a good partnership," said Wachtell of the mount she's had for nine years. "He's not the fastest or the most scopey, but he listens really well, so that worked to my advantage.

"I feel lucky to have been able to develop with him," continued





been clear in both grand prix, so for a horse just turning nine, I'm really impressed by him." he said. "I had a little problem in the jump-off here in December in the four star, and the same turn was here tonight, so I was a little chicken tonight. I wasn't going to be fast enough and hoped these guys would make a mistake, but they're a bit too good for that."

O'Shea finished fourth riding Skara Glen's Chancelloress in 46.71 seconds for owner Skara Glen Stables, while Keenan and Fasther, owned by Chansonette Farm LLC, capped the top five on four faults in 40.46 seconds. Keenan's performance also guaranteed her the Martha Jolicoeur Leading Lady Rider Award for the second week in a row. Rounding out the jump-off, Minikus and his own Calvalou took sixth on four faults in 41.76 seconds.







WEF 2 JUMPER HIGHLIGHTS

Charlie Jayne (USA) opened the first week of international competition at the 2020 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) with a win riding Tou La Moon in the \$6,000 Bainbridge 1.40m CSI2*. Jayne appeared in the middle of a 97-horse field over a two-phase course set by course designer Oscar Soberon (MEX). Tou La Moon, a 12-year-old Belgian Warmblood mare (Toulon x Skippy II) owned by Alex Jayne and Maura Thatcher, carried Jayne clear over the first phase and stopped the clock with more than a second to spare in 27.80 seconds over runner-up Stella Manship (USA) riding Dundalk, owned by Elan

Behind Manship's time of 29.22 seconds, the USA's Molly Ashe Cawley took third aboard Van de Emma in 29.49 seconds for owner Oakridge Farm. Ireland's Capt. Brian Cournane was fourth riding Colourful Lady, owned by Glenbeigh Farm LLC, in 29.83 seconds, while Rebecca Conway (USA) capped the top five in 30.34 seconds on Con Coleur for owner Blue Hill Farm, LLC.

Also winning in the International Arena at WEF on Wednesday, Mario Deslauriers (CAN) topped the \$8,000 Douglas Elliman 1.45m riding Cloud 39, owned by Wishing Well Farm LLC, and U.S. Olympic team gold medalist McLain Ward claimed the \$6,000 1.40m riding Errol, owned by Sagamore Farms, to close out the day.

U.S. Olympic team silver medalist Kent Farrington and Kaprice had the speed to win the \$37,000 Equinimity WEF Challenge Cup Round 2 CSI2* on Thursday. The 22-horse jump-off was a who's who of top sport from a competitive starting field of 103 horses. Farrington utilized Kaprice's foot speed to stop Oscar Soberon's (USA) short track clock at 37.44 seconds over fellow U.S. rider Abigail McArdle riding Victorio 5, who collected a time of 38.36 seconds for owner Victorio Equine Group LLC.

Under 25 rider Taylor St. Jacques (USA) held the lead for several trips, but settled for third riding her own Upsilon de la Liniere, in a time of 38.62 seconds, while Brazil's Rodrigo Pessoa took fourth in 38.82 seconds aboard Venice Beach for owner Artemis Equestrian Farm LLC. Capping the top five. Lacey Gilberston (USA), stopped the clock and 39.01 seconds riding Baloppi for owner Seabrook LLC.

Also winning in the International Arena at WEF on Thursday, Conor Swail (IRL) topped the \$8,000 Douglas Elliman 1.45m riding Gamble, owned by

The future of show jumping was featured in the Spy Coast Farm 7-Year-Old Young Jumper 1.30m with Canada's Erynn Ballard and Hathina Z taking the victory with more than a second to spare over fellow Canadian Mario Deslauriers riding Cantinori. Ballard stopped the clock double-clear in 36.209 seconds in the two-round class set by course designer Ana Catalina Cruz Harris (MEX), while Deslauriers posted a time of 37.371 seconds for owners Aram Ampagoumian LLC and Wishing Well Farm LLC.

Hathina Z joined Ballard's string from the European edition of The Ten Auction in 2019 and is being aimed at the \$20,000 Spy Coast Farm Seven Year Old Developing Jumper Series Classic at the conclusion of the season.

Ireland's Shane Sweetnam finished third riding HDB Quality, owned by Sweet Oak Farm and Spy Coast Farm, while Quentin Judge (USA) took fourth on HH Zorro Z for Double H Farm. Maggie McAlary (USA) rounded out the top five riding her own Cajou van Overiz Z.

Also winning in the International Arena at WEF on Friday was Olivia Herbert (USA) who won the \$2,500 Lugano Diamonds High Amateur-Owner Jumper riding Chakato VL, and John Nagus (USA) topped the \$1,500 Griffis Residential High Junior Jumper aboard W. Tonix Hero, owned by Stephanie E Angus. In the FEI ranks, Luis Larrazabal (VEN) claimed victory in the \$6,000 Bainbridge 1.40m CSI2* on Caristina for owner San Francisco Stables LLC.

Winning in the International Arena at WEF on Saturday was Emily Ward (USA), who kicked of Under 25 competition with a victory in the \$10,000 Hermés Under 25 Welcome riding Millioninmind, owned by Stephan Barnes. Jennifer Gates (USA) won the \$15,000 Lugano Diamond SJHOF High Amateur-Owner Jumper Classic on Alex for Evergate Stable, LLC, while Flo Norris (USA) topped the \$10,000 Griffis Residential SJHOF High Junior Jumper Classic on Elton d'Acceglio for owner Cisca Norris.

Andrew Welles rode Brindis Bogibo, a 14-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding, to best a field of 67 and win the \$37,000 CaptiveOne Advisors 1.45m Classic CSI2* to close out the week in the International Arena at WEF.

Speed and strategy were in tall order as Welles guided his mount through a 13-horse jump-off to stop the timers at 36.58 seconds for owner Itasca Group LLC. Ireland's Capt. Brian Cournane finished the runner-up riding Penelope Cruz to a double-clear performance in 37.71 seconds. Tomas Yofre (ARG) took third aboard Dasino in 37.95 seconds for owner Peacock Ridge LLC, and Bliss Heers (USA) finishing fourth on Cavani SN in 38.04 seconds for owner Team Philippaerts. Schuyler Riley (USA) capped the top five riding Iceman de Muze, owned by E2 Show Jumpers, in 38.76 seconds.
