

YOUNG TALENT SCORES \$150,000 NATIONS CUP CSIO4* VICTORY FOR UNITED STATES

The future of U.S. show jumping was shining bright as a team of up-and-coming athletes dominated the \$150,000 Nations Cup CSIO4* in the International Arena during week eight on Saturday evening, February 29, at WEF.

The "Saturday Night Lights" Nations Cup consisted of two rounds over a course set by the USA's Ken Krome. Teams of four represented the nations of Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Ireland, Israel, Mexico, and the United States. After the first round, each team dropped their highest score, and the top-six teams returned in order of highest to lowest total faults in the second round. The winner was determined by the lowest total of each team's top-three riders from each round.

The six teams that returned for the second round included the fault-free United States, Ireland on five faults, Brazil and Canada on a tally of 13 faults apiece, and Australia and Israel with 17 faults each.

Leading the way, the NetJets U.S. Jumping Team consisting of Andy Kocher aboard Squirt Gun, Brian Moggre on MTM Vivre le Reve, Lucas Porter with C Hunter, and Adrienne Sternlicht riding Just A Gamble, carried the leading scores in both rounds and finished the night on just four penalties for the win. The U.S. riders were coached by Chef d'Équipe Robert Ridland. Irish riders David Blake, Darragh Kenny, Paul O'Shea, and Billy Twomey took the silver-medal position on 13 faults, while Australia's Amy Graham, Scott Keach, Hilary Scott, and Rowan Willis rounded out the podium.

Sitting pretty on a perfect score after Kocher's lone time fault served as the drop score from round one, U.S. riders were primed for a win on home soil. A double-clear performance from 18-year-old Moggre and his 11-yearold Westphalian gelding (Ustinov x Chello II) sealed the victory for his team in his senior Nations Cup debut.

"Everybody wants to jump clear their first time on the team, so for my horse to make that happen for me, I couldn't be more thankful," said Moggre of Flower Mound, TX. "It's quite a surreal feeling. To be on the team here really meant a lot. MTM Vivre la Reve is my top horse at the moment. He's a horse I know like the back of my hand."

Fellow young rider Porter, 22, of Wellington, FL, notched a fault-free ride in the opening round and settled on a single rail in the second riding longtime partner C Hunter, a 13-yearold Zangersheide stallion (Cassini II x Corland).

"I was really thankful to be a part of the team, and I aimed at this Nations

RODRIGO LAMBRE AND CATOVER CLIMB TO TOP OF PREMIER EQUESTRIAN GRAND PRIX CSIO4*

Brazilian rider Rodrigo Lambre, topped the \$214,000 Premier Equestrian Grand Prix CSIO4* riding Catover on Sunday, March 1, 2020, to conclude week eight of the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) in Wellington, FL.

USA's Ken Krome set a two-round track for 50 challengers in the final event of the week, and saw eight qualify for a tie-breaking jump-off. Lambre saved the best for last as the final jump-off rider. He and Catover were fast and precise to stop the clock double-clear in 37.73 seconds for the win over Ireland's Shane Sweetnam and Chaqui Z in 38.29 seconds.

"He is amazing," said Lambre of Catover, an 11-year-old Holsteiner stallion (Catoki x Contact Me) owned by Mario Onate. "I have had him since he was eight, and I flat him almost every day but I've only actually been riding him seriously since October of last year in preparation for Tokyo. We all have Tokyo in mind this year; it's our dream. It's a difficult year to qualify for the team in every country, but we have also so many nations cups and so many shows that we can go in, it's promising."

Of Catover, Lambre continued, "He's not a really fast horse, but he has a huge stride. I think today was a jumpoff that I could use that. I won doing the seven to the last jump, which for many horses was very far. The footing feels better for sure this year and, for me, if my horse is happy, I am happy." Sweetnam and Chaqui Z, a 14-yearold Zangershiede stallion (Chacco Blue x Quinar Z) finished just off the pace for owner Spy Coast Farm LLC, but Sweetnam was pleased with the performance.

"I was delighted with him. This is only his first time that he's shown here this year, and it's only his first real big class," said Sweetnam. "He felt great, and I think his jump-off was excellent. Even though he's 14, he feels like he's eight. So, I'm really happy with where he is at the moment."

Finishing third in 39.08 seconds, Alexandra Thornton (GBR) is making her return to WEF after five years away from the North American show scene, saying, "I've been based in Europe since 2012, so it's a long way to come. Last time I came, it was a completely different experience. The footing is amazing, which makes a world of difference for the horses. And actually I've extended my trip!"

Thornton piloted Charielle, a 14-year-old Oldenburg mare (Chacco-Blue x Argentinus), which was originally sold to her by Lambre and is now owned by Dunwalke Ltd.

"I don't think he's seen her live since I came and tried her in Mexico four or five years ago!" said Thornton, who's finish guaranteed her the Martha Jolicoeur Leading Lady Grand Prix Rider Award for week eight. "I think it's really great that Martha offers this award for us. Female riders are often



Cup since the start of the season here in Florida," said Porter, who was also making his senior Nations Cup debut. "I thought my horse jumped two great rounds tonight. He jumped a really amazing first round and was a bit unlucky with my rail, but I'm really happy with him. We've come a long way together. I look forward to what the future holds with him. He's a really special horse to me and our family."

"He's by far the best horse that I have at the moment," said Kocher of the nine-year-old Oldenburg gelding (Diarado x Quick Star) owned by Eve Candy Jumpers. "Last year in the high schooling [jumpers] at WEF, I fell off him

our first time out, so it's incredible what 18 months can do. He's the best horse I've ever had so far in my career."

Coming in with the most team experience under her belt, Sternlicht, 26, hailing from Greenwich, CT, served as the anchor rider and posted a clear round with Just A Gamble, but did not return for the second round thanks to her teammates scores securing the win.

"I'm verv thankful for my teammates who made it very easy for me," she said. "I think we're a young team, but have a lot of strong riders who have had consistencies leading up to this event. I think that was showcased in their awesome rides.

"It took me awhile to get to know [Just A Gamble], but I think our partnership really started to solidify," said Sternlicht of her 11-yearold Belgian Warmblood mare. "She's been very consistent. I would say that she ranks as my second or third horse, and she's been an

unbelievable support system for my top mare, Cristalline, just coming back."

A very proud Chef d'Équipe, Ridland noted of his young team, "This team was chosen right down the ranking list of the applicants, and to see them do that tonight was just amazing.

"It really fits into what we've always tried to do; you can have a team of three veterans and two newer riders, but it's all in the same spirit of giving experience when it really counts," continued Ridland. "There's nothing like pressure at home; it's Saturday night with everything on the line, and nobody in the stands cares that this is their debut. They're rooting for the Americans! The American flag was everywhere, and it's a different kind of pressure at home. For these riders to experience that and to have the flag on the saddle pad for the first time, this is invaluable."



Adrienne Sternlicht (USA) won the \$5,000 Premier Equestrian Welcome Stake CSIO4* riding Cadans Z to open week eight of WEF. Sternlicht had the accuracy and speed to top a field of 65 over tracks set by course designer Ken Krome (USA). She and Cadans Z, owned by Starlight Farms 1, LLC, stopped the clock at 62.59 seconds over second-place finisher Todd Minikus (USA) and his own Calvalou in a time of 64.02 seconds. Great Britain's Ben Maher rounded out the podium finishes with Ginger-Blue, owned by Jane Forbes Clark, stopping the clock in 67.78 seconds.

Riding for the United States, Andrew Ramsay took fourth aboard Stranger 30, owned by The Stranger Group, with a time of 67.86 seconds, while fellow U.S. rider Abigail McArdle capped the top five riding I&H Boogy Woogy, owned by Parot Horses LLC, in a final time of 68.59 seconds.

Making their debut under the lights during week eight, Brianne Goutal-Marteau (USA) won the evening edition of the \$5,000 Premier Equestrian Welcome Stake CSIO4* riding Tanael des Bonnes for owner Gerald Ford. Israel's Alberto Michan finished the runner-up on Ictus d'Emma, owned by Wolver Hollow, and Samuel Parot Jr. (CHI) rounded out the top three aboard Buga Z for owner Samuel Parot.

Also winning the International Arena on Wednesday, Peter Leone (USA) topped the \$6,000 Bainbridge Companies 1.40m, riding Capito Z, owned by Capito Group LLC.

Darragh Kenny (IRL) and Carthano cruised to victory in the \$37,000 Equinimity WEF Challenge Cup Round 8 CSIO4* on Thursday. When Kenny entered the ring as one of the final five riders to compete, the time to beat had been set at 64.39 seconds by the USA's Andrew Ramsay and Stranger 30. The pair had held the lead for three-quarters of the class, but Kenny and his new partner, Carthano, overtook them with a time of 63.67 seconds, ultimately securing Kenny the victory. Ramsay and Stranger 30, owned by the Stranger Group, finished in second, while third place with a time of 64.62 seconds went to the USA's Lucas Porter and Diamonte Darco, owned by Sleepy P Ranch LLC.

Finishing fourth in Thursday's WEF Challenge Cup was Great Britain's Ben Maher, who stopped the clock in 66.23 seconds riding Ginger-Blue for owner Jane Forbes Clark. Fifth place with a time of 66.37 seconds went to Canada's Sam Walker and Kel'Star du Vingt Ponts, owned by Castlefield Sport Horses.

Also winning in the International Arena at WEF on Thursday, Natalie Dean (USA) topped the \$10,000 Hermès Under 25 Welcome riding Don's Diamant, owned by Marigold Sporthorses, LLC.

It came down to a minute to win it in the \$37,000 Douglas Elliman Real Estate 1.45m Classic CSIO4* to highlight daytime competition in the International Arena on Friday. Well on his way to making his in-ring debut on the NetJets U.S. Jumping Team this weekend, Brian Moggre, 18, was the only rider to break the one-minute mark over the speed track.

Moggre, hailing from Flower Mound, TX, bested a field of 47 riders to win aboard new mount Nikita Jolie, the horse he owns together with Ken

Also winning in the International Arena at WEF on Friday, Peter Lutz (USA) topped the \$6,000 Bainbridge Companies 1.40m Jumper Speed Challenge riding Air Pia Vg Z, owned by Swede Ventures LLC.

Ireland's Darragh Kenny led a twelve-horse jump-off with a speedy finish in Saturday's \$50.000 CaptiveOne Advisors 1.50m National Grand Prix riding 12-year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding Important De Muze, owned by Kerry Anne LLC. The pair posted a time of 35.96 seconds to best an international field.

Behind Kenny in second place, McLain Ward (USA) rode his own Mundill to a time of 36.555 seconds. Finishing close behind in third place was Jessica Mendoza from Great Britain aboard Dollar Girl producing a clear round with a time of 36.827 seconds for owner Winsor Farms. Fourth place went to Antonio Martinez, Jr. (VEN) and Forman De Virton, owned by Tack Up Stable Corp. with no faults and a time of 37.553 seconds. Rounding out the top five, Molly Ashe Cawley (USA) rode Van De Emma to a time of 39.093 seconds for owner Oakridge Farm.



the minority in some of these grand prix classes, but there were three in the jumpoff today who all rode fantastically. To win this award against them was really exciting."

Luis Pedro Biraben (ARG) finished in fourth riding Colorado 210 for owner Miguel Madero, while Israel's Sydney Shulman rounded out the top five on J-Boston S.E., a horse she owns together with her mother Jill Shulman.





"He's got a big stride to him so I could really show off in round one and I thought the ring and the course let me do that," Isop described. "This is a really lovely venue. I'm so happy that WEF decided to open up these rings to the International and National derbies.'

The pair was the last of twelve to return for the handy and after a flawless performance, Isop and Believe were able to keep their lead.

"My plan going into the handy was just to keep it cool. As well as having a really big stride, he is incredibly handy and I think that really helped us with this course," Isop explained. "He's plenty scopey, he let me gallop right on down to the last oxer, which was quite big, and I think that actually was our best part of the course!"



Of her jump-off, Shulman said, "I planned to do five, which is the leave out, from jumps two to three. I did not get it done as well as I would have liked, but I was really grateful for Ginger in that moment because she really took the wheel. It was a little bit of a blind run to the double, but she was very careful and got out of the way. These are all great riders in this class, and the top three are really competitive, so it just worked in our favor today."

Less than three-tenths of a second stood between Shulman and Tanimara Macari (MEX), who was last to go in the tie-breaking round riding Feminka for owner Jorge Macari. She and the 10-year-old Dutch Warmblood mare (Verdi TN x Numero Uno) came up just shy of the victory in 31.84 seconds.

"This time it was all or nothing; my trainer said, 'We have to go for it this time!'," said Macari. "It worked out. Not as much as we thought it would, but second is great. [Feminka and I] have been growing together since she was seven. Every time that we're in there, she fights for me to her fullest. We're really partners.

"This is my first year doing the complete [Under 25] season, and I think it's a great opportunity to prepare yourself for the bigger classes," continued Macari of her history in the division.

Rounding out the podium, 23-year-old Jessica Mendoza (GBR) piloted her own Diamants Aurora to third in a time of 31.89 seconds.

"Sydney had a very guick round. and I didn't think I could beat it, but I thought I'd give it a go," said Mendoza, who has been competing in Under 25 classes for three years. "This is actually my mare's third jump-off with me, so I thought this time I'd really try and give her a quick ride, and she was amazing."

Also posting a double clear. Flo Norris (GBR) took fourth in 31.96 seconds riding Con Pleasure 4, owned by Cisca Norris. Capping the top five, Sophie Gochman (USA) and Carola BH stopped the clock at 33.70 seconds for owner Gochman Sport Horses LLC.
