

All Bets on Bertram as the Irishman Notched Second Win of WEF 6

Opening the final day of week six at the 2021 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF), it was Bertram Allen (IRL) and Castlefield Vegas, owned by Martin Egan, taking the top spot in the 137,000 IDA Development Grand Prix CSI3* held on the grass Derby Field at Equestrian Village, on Sunday, February 21.

In the first round of Sunday's grand prix, the final line on course featured a triple combination [vertical, oxer, vertical] followed by five strides down to the IDA Developments oxer, the final jump on course. This combination of jumps proved to be one of the most difficult sections of the track designed by Catsy Cruz (MEX). A starting field of 45 combinations challenged the course, with 18 qualifying to return for the jump-off.

Fresh off their victory in the Adequan® WEF Challenge Cup on Friday, Allen and the 11-year-old Irish Sport Horse gelding by Cassino x Lux Z did it again, putting forth a blistering double-clear effort to stop the clock in 37.10 seconds.

"I knew I just had to give it everything I had," said the 26-yearold rider. "I didn't watch Nayel's round, but I was talking to a few people and they said it was very fast and my guy is naturally fast, so my plan was to just be as fast as I could be without doing anything crazy. It all came up great. Friday was the biggest class he's [Castlefield Vegas] jumped so far, and he won that, so I was delighted. Today I was interested to see how he would go along with that. He jumped great, and I had a good feeling."

Less than three-tenths of a second off the leader, Egypt's Nayel Nassar rode Igor Van De Wittemoere owned by Evergate Stables, LLC, to a secondplace finish. Nassar and the 13-yearold gelding by Cooper VD Heffinck x Orlando 96, also posted a doubleclear round in 37.39 seconds. The pair has been together for about a year now so their success on Sunday comes as a very exciting step in the right direction.

"It has been a bit of a process trying to get him going the way I would like him to," said the 30-yearold rider. "He has a ton of energy and so much blood, and sometimes he tends to rush the jumps a bit. We've been messing around with bridles and doing a lot of flatwork just to try to get him to switch a few gears, and I was so pleased with him today. He jumped the first round spectacularly and came back to jump the jump-off even better. I thought we had it won, but this guy [Bertram] is pretty darn fast. We are so happy with the result and just very pleased with how he's coming along."

Rounding out the top three it was Paul O'Shea (IRL) and Skara Glen's

Amanda Steege Pilots Lafitte De Muze to a Victory in the \$50,000 WCHR Peter Wetherill Palm Beach Hunter Spectacular

Seasoned hunter rider Amanda Steege guided Cheryl Olsten's Lafitte De Muze to top honors in the \$50,000 WCHR Peter Wetherill Palm Beach Hunter Spectacular during "Saturday Night Lights" at the 2021 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF).

Thirty-three junior, amateur, and professional hunter riders took their turn over the track designed by Andy Christiansen. The course consisted of 12 elements and was offered at 3'6", 3'9", and the 4' height. After all riders completed the first course, the top 12 returned for a second classic round. Six judges split into three panels oversaw the class with panel one consisting of Mary Lisa Leffler and Chris Wynne, panel two being Rachel Kennedy and Sissy Wickes, and the final panel including Tom Brennan and Mark Jungherr.

Eleventh to go, Laena Romond, of Brookfield, CT, and Catherine Cowie's Traveller took an early lead with a score of 89.66 and held onto the top spot for the remainder of the first round. Less than a full point behind Romond was Wellington, FL, resident Jimmy Torano aboard Isalou, Inc.'s Laskano with a score of 89.16. Steege, of Bedminster, NJ, and Lafitte De Muze were sitting in third place going into the second round with a score of 88.91. The top 12 riders who returned for the second round consisted of 10 professionals and two junior riders.

Tenth to come back in the order, Steege and the 10-year-old Belgian Warmblood by Darco showed off their handiness and rideability to receive a score of 88.83, which put the pair at the top of the leaderboard with an overall score of 177.74.

"My plan for round one was to just go as smoothly as I could and show off some galloping; I can trust that he's going to jump the jumps with amazing style so I was just trying to do my job the best way that I could," explained Steege. "For the second round, I did a different plan than the one we had decided when we walked it. Liza [Boyd] and I walked together with a few others, and we were not planning on doing some of the inside slices that we did. As we were watching people go and people started doing tighter turns and judges seemed to reward that, I actually phoned a friend. I called Tom Wright who was sitting in the stands literally as I was at the gate, and he helped me formulate a plan that he thought would be the best for Lafitte. I was happy that I was able to make it work."

Elizabeth Towell-Boyd and Gigi Manigault's Walk-Off finished the first round in tenth place and then received the highest second round score of 91 to finish in second overall. Their second round score combined

Ireland's Bertram Allen and Castlefield Vegas, owned by Martin Egan, finished in top form to take the victory in the \$37,000 Adequan® WEF Challenge Cup Round 6 CSI3* on Friday. Last to go in the order, Allen and the 11-yearold Irish Sport Horse gelding by Cassino x Lux Z posted the fastest time of the day, leaving all the jumps in their cups in 36.09 seconds.

It was less than a second separating the winner from the runner-up as Beezie Madden (USA) and her veteran partner Breitling LS, owned by Abigail Wexner slotted into second place. Madden and the 15-year-old Dutch Warmblood stallion by Quintero x Accord II put forth a double-clear effort in 37 seconds flat.

Paul O'Shea (IRL) piloted Skara Glen's Chancelloress, owned by Skara Glen Stables, to a third-place finish. O'Shea and the 12-year-old Dutch Warmblood mare by Chacco Blue x Balou du Rouet left all the rails up for a double-clear finish in 37.72 seconds.

Natalie Dean (USA) and Dotcom D'Authiut wrapped up Friday with a victory in the \$1,000 Hermès U25 1.40m. Dean and the eight-year-old Selle Français mare, owned by Marigold Sporthorses, LLC, took the win in the speed class by more than three seconds, stopping the clock at 65.89 seconds.

A successful week at WEF continued for Gavin Harley (IRL) and Corbawido PS, owned by Wolfstone Stables and Sales Inc, as they flew to the top of the podium in the \$37,000 CaptiveOne Advisors 1.50m Classic CSI3*.

Harley and the nine-year-old Polish Warmblood geld clear effort in 39.44 seconds.

A regular contender at WEF, Jessica Springsteen (USA) piloted Hungry Heart, owned by Stone Hill Farm, to a quick double-clear just off the mark, as she and the nine-year-old Swedish Warmblood gelding by Baltimore 1178 x Loucaibo took second place in 39.72 sesconds.

First to return in the second round, Daniel Deusser (GER) and Calisto Blue, owned by Stephex Stables, galloped effortlessly across the track to set the pace for the rest of the field, with a fault-free round in 39.99 seconds. He and the 14-year-old Oldenburg gelding by Chacco Blue x Con Air held the lead until the final few horses, ultimately landing them in third position.

To open Saturday competition on the Derby Field, Tanner Korotkin (USA) and Deauville S, owned by Castlewood Farm Inc, captured the Hermès Under 25 Welcome speed class. Korotkin and the 15-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Diamant De Semilly x Lux Z topped the starting field of 66 entries, posting a time of 60.46 seconds.

Competition concluded on the Derby Field at PBIEC on Sunday, February 21, after Ireland's Paul O'Shea claimed victory in the \$25,000 CP National Grand Prix aboard Eye Candy Jumpers' Squirt Gun.

With 35 riders testing the first track, the jump-off only welcomed back two combinations to navigate the day's final course. O'Shea and the 2011 Oldenburg gelding by Diarado ended the afternoon as the only pair to go double clear in a time of 39.526 seconds.

Second place in the \$25,000 CP National Grand Prix went to Juan Manuel Gallego (COL) and Havana de la Lande, a 2007 Belgian Warmblood mare by Nabab de Reve owned by Elise Uribe, who crossed through timers in 38.484 seconds, but with four faults. Third place was awarded to the USA's Alex Matz riding Flash, a 2010 KWPN gelding by Numero Uno owned by 5 Star Partners, who ended their day in the first round with four faults in 82.777 seconds.


WEF 6 JUMPER HIGHLIGHTS

On the grass Derby Field at Equestrian Village, Ashlee Bond (ISR) and Imagine, owned by Aurora Farms and Little Valley Farms, captured the Douglas Elliman Real Estate 1.45m Jumpers CSI3* to open FEI competition during Week 6 of WEF.

A total of 40 entries contested the two-phase track set by Catsy Cruz (MEX), which featured nine jumping efforts in the first phase, moving over to an additional six efforts in the second phase. With 15 passing the initial test, it was the best for last on the day as Bond and the eight-year-old Dutch Warmblood mare by Emerald x Heartbreaker jumped double clear and posted the fastest time of 26.24 seconds.

Canada's Erynn Ballard was second last to go, posting a double clear effort aboard Classic Penny, a nine-year-old Norwegian Warmblood mare by Clapton x Brokers Plastic City, owned by Ilan Ferder, finishing in 27.38 seconds. Rounding out the top three was Alex Matz (USA) with Davidson, a 13-year-old gelding by Harley VDL x Chin Chin owned by 5 Star Partners, crossing the finish line fault-free in 28.45 seconds.

Harley and the nine-year-old Polish Warmblood gelding by Cornet's Balou x Widolan, stuck to their plan and it paid off, finishing with a double-

Chancelloress, owned by Skara Glen Stables, leaving all the jumps in their cups in a time of 38.35 seconds. O'Shea and the 12-year-old Dutch Warmblood mare by Chacco Blue x Balou du Rouet had a successful week overall, after also finishing third in Friday's qualifier.

"I thought it was a great course," said O'Shea, who is ranked 40th in the world. "I was very happy with my mare. She was good the other day too, so I think we went as quick as we could. I'm very happy with her, and at least another Irishman won! Bertram's horse is co-owned by a very good friend of mine, so it's great to see them going so well."

Allen, who sits 46th in the world rankings, echoed the praise of other international competitors of the quality of the turf, after racking up three wins to date with Castlefield Vegas on the grass Derby Field during the 2021 WEF.

"Everyone is delighted to be able to jump on the grass," he said with a smile. "There is so much space and everyone loves jumping out here, so it's nice."

Walker Welcomes a Win in \$25,000 Hermès Under 25 Grand Prix

It was Sam Walker (CAN) and Marbill Hill Farm's Coralissa who jumped to the top of the leaderboard after 63 horse-and-rider combinations took to the Derby Field in the \$25,000 Hermès Under 25 Grand Prix on Sunday afternoon, with nine pairs returning to the jump-off round set by designer Catsy Cruz (MEX).

Walker and the 2010 Holsteiner mare by Com Air were one of two combinations to put in two fault-free rounds, finishing the short course in 43.89 seconds. "This past year with the pandemic, I pretty much took a full year off from competition," said Walker. "To come back out here and do so well today, to feel her still in her prime, it really means a lot to me."

Walker stuck to his plan from start to finish and was thrilled with the pay-off. "My first round went according to plan," he explained. "Every line I had walked in in the course walk and observed when watching the rest of the class, I stuck to the plan all the way around. My horse was really good today and jumped fantastically. The first round set us up very nicely for the jump-off. Going into the jump-off, my horse is super-fast but has a shorter step, and I took that into account. I stuck to my plan and just went for it."

Walker and the mare have a lengthy partnership, and their resume includes the 2019 team gold and individual silver medals at the Adeguan[®]/FEI North American Youth Championships. "I've had this mare since she was seven years

old," he said. "We've had a really great, successful partnership thus far. She has had multiple FEI wins so far. She's a special horse, and I'm thrilled with the day's outcome.'

Walker concluded with thoughts about the U25 Series and his hopes for its future. "It's fantastic having a series like this for the U25 riders to compete in." noted the 18-year-old rider. "It's a crucial step in bringing junior riders up the ranks and also a great opportunity for riders who maybe didn't get the chance to jump in the juniors or go to young riders. It's a great alternative for that. As far as the competitiveness, it's an extremely competitive division, and I think that we will only see numbers grow in the years to come because it's also a lot of fun."

Second place in the \$25,000 Hermès U25 Grand Prix went to Violet Lindemann Barnett (USA) and Lindemann Barnett Sporthorses' 2010 Selle Français mare by Allegreto, Alanine de Vains, who made it through the jump-off timers in 46.85 seconds. Third place went to Ashley Vogel (USA) and her own Bellissimo Z, a 2009 Zangersheide mare by Bamako de Muze, who ended on four faults and in 42.58 seconds.

Meet The Riders of WEF: Cara McFadden

Q: How long have you been riding, and how did you start?

A: I've been riding for ten years, since I was seven years old, and I got into it because of my mom. Elisabeth. She rode with Beacon Hill as a child, so it's really cool because I actually have her old trunk from Beacon Hill. She knows the program so well, even though it's a different trainer. It's so cool that we ride at the same barn and can share that. I think when I was about seven she brought me to the barn for the first time.

Q: Who do you train with and what horses are you showing this season?

A: I ride with Beacon Hill Show Stables. I usually show Acido 7, but sadly he is injured right now, and we are hoping he will be back for finals this Fall. I showed Laramy in the 15-17 Equitation and Serafino in the 3'3" Junior Hunters for the first time since Capital Challenge 2019, which was amazing. I'm also showing Argento in the Low Children's Jumpers. Argento is 19 years old and teaching me how to do the jumpers, which has been so much fun.

Q: Do you prefer hunters, jumpers, or equitation?

A: I like the equitation for the fun courses and the tests. I also like all the unique classes that they have and the thrill of trying to gualify and get points. I think I'm way less stressed doing the hunters and jumpers though! I put a lot less stress on myself in the hunter and jumper classes.

Q: If you could ride any famous horse who would it be?

A: HH Azur! McLain Ward rides her so well, and she looks so calm and relaxed even though she's jumping these giant jumps. I think it would be so much fun to experience what her jump feels like and what she is like in the ring. It would be interesting to see if she is a totally different horse with me compared to McLain.

Q: Who has had the biggest impact on your riding career?

A: Definitely my mom! She is always helping me around the barn, taking care of my horses. We take care of Serafino on our own, so she has been my groom this week. She is always with me and supporting me. I'm thankful that she never pushed me into horses or made me ride. She let me find my love for the sport on my own.

Q: How do you balance school and riding?

A: COVID has actually made that easier since I am in school online and can be down here full time. It's nice not having to worry about flying back and forth. Stacia Madden also makes sure that she has my school schedule so she can plan that I ride during my free periods, after school, or even before school. It's typically really long days, but worth it.

Q: What is your favorite part about showing at WEF?

A: I love the trails and pathways around the show grounds. They are so pretty with all the palm trees around them. I love getting to walk around and see all the different classes going on and enjoy the beautiful view.

with their first round score of 86.66 gave them a total score of 177.66. Unlike many of the horses in the class, this was Boyd's first time competing Walk-Off under the lights.

"My horse is honored to be second to a horse like Laffite," commented Boyd. "Being green the first round I was a little cautious, and then the second round arrived and I was in tenth place, and I thought, 'We'll just go for it,' and he really stepped up to the plate. He really proved to me that he's a derby horse in the making."

Third place honors were earned by Geoffrey Hesslink, of Shelbourne, VT, and Shadowfax Equestrian LLC's Bond. Hesslink rode Bond to a first round score 87.16 to put them in sixth. The duo received a second round score of 89.33 which put them right behind Steege and Boyd.

"Bond is lovely. He does the junior hunters with his rider Isha [Swani]," said Hesslink. "He's done this class twice with her so I knew he would be more than ready to do it. He's always game for anything so I just tried to put in a nice smooth round."

"I thought the course was great," continued Hesslink. "I like having more single jumps and there were a lot of those today, I thought it was nice that they also incorporated some trickier jumps that we haven't seen here in the past."

"It's a huge honor for him to have this class on his resume," said Steege, who placed second with Lafitte de Muze in the Hunter Spectacular in 2019. "It's a class that's very important to me every year and very important to his owner. Every year when we sit down and make his schedule, we plan his Florida season around this event to get to and to try to win. There are months of work that go into preparing for this class. This is a hard and stressful week; at first, you're just happy to be gualified and then for me, once I'm gualified I can take a breath and really go in there and show off. It's an experience that I'll never forget."
