Patience Pays Off for Adam Prudent in the \$214,000 Wellington Agricultural Services Grand Prix CSI4*

In Saturday's feature class during WEF 12, it was an exciting finish for Adam Prudent (USA) and Baloutinue, owned by Plain Bay Farm, as they raced to a victory in the \$214,000 Wellington Agricultural Services Grand Prix CSI4* on Saturday, April 3, in the International Arena at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC).

A starting field of 42 horse-and-rider combinations set out over the 1.60m track designed by Olaf Petersen Jr. (GER) with eight pairs, representing four different nations, qualifying for the jump-off round.

First to return, Ioli Mytilineou (GRE) and Levis De Muze set the tone for the day with an impressive double-clear round making 40.20 seconds the time to beat. Multiple changes atop the leaderboard would continue from there as Canada's Jim Ifko entered next guiding Un Diamant Des Forets owned by Eventyre Farms Ltd, to a double-clear finish, besting the leading time in 36.54 seconds.

The next rider found a way to get the job done even faster as Prudent and the 11-year-old Hanoverian gelding by Balou du Rouet x Landor S, produced a double-clear round in a blazing 35.28 seconds.

Riding in the sixth spot in the jump-off field of eight, Kent Farrington (USA) and Gazelle, owned by Kent Farrington and Robin Parsky, gave it a solid run. The Olympic team silver medalist guided his 15-year-old Belgian Warmblood mare by

Kashmir van Schuttershof x Indoctro to a clear round in 37.37 seconds.

For Prudent, the win marks an even sweeter victory with a horse he has had for almost four years. He and his team at Plain Bay Farm have taken the development of the talented gelding slowly, only moving him up to the four and five-star level this season.

"The horse is very careful," he said. "I haven't really had a chance to go fast yet since this is only my third grand prix jump-off with him. I pushed it to the limit this time and really asked him to perform the best he could. I knew I had a lot of fast people behind me so wanted to really lay it down and take every risk I could, and it worked out quite well."

Ifko and "Monty," a 13-year-old Selle Français stallion by Diamant de Semilly x Papillon Rouge, ended the day in second place to wrap up a very successful 2021 WEF campaign that included wins in the \$37,000 Restylane 1.45m Qualifier CSI2* during WEF 5 and the \$50,000 Wellington Equestrian Realty Grand Prix CSI2* during WEF 9.

"Monty is a very aggressive stallion when he's in the ring," said Ifko with a smile. "He's a competitor for sure! In the jump-off we maybe had a bit of an advantage in the two lines that were both long nine strides to verticals. He has the ability to run down to a vertical and still leave it up, so I felt confident galloping quickly down both of those lines. Luckily enough, it

first round to earn a high score of 182. The pair held onto the lead for the remainder of the classic round. Last to go in the handy, Crolick and the 10-year-old Mecklenburg gelding by Chacco Blue showed off their style and rideability to earn a score of 192.5 and top honors in the class.

"[The course] rode really beautiful," commented Crolick, "were gorgeous, very flowing and very smooth. I just went in there today and had a good round; it felt great.

Hunter riders entered the Derby Field at Equestrian Village one last time for the \$50,000 USHJA International Hunter Derby on Saturday, April 3, of WEF 12. Twenty-seven of the top hunter horse-and-rider combinations entered the two-round class with the hopes of winning the top prize. In the end, Greg Crolick and Carole Chase's Chappy produced two flawless rounds to earn a total score of 374.5 and take home the blue ribbon.

Havens Schatt, of Georgetown, KY, and Ken and Amy Wexler LLC's Cascartini finished with a second place ribbon in the class and a total score of 371.5. Third place was awarded to Elizabeth Towell Boyd, of Camden, SC, and Rebekah Warren's Cassico with an overall score of 370.

Riders were asked to navigate a classic round course, designed by Ken Krome, consisting of 13 fences and offering four high options. After completing the first round, the top 12 combinations returned for the handy course to impress the judges one last time. The 10-fence handy round included a trot jump to a two-stride line and four high option fences.

Crolick, of Clarkston, MI, and Chappy were first in the order of go and produced a picture-perfect

"My plan was to try to be as handy as I could," he continued, "but also as careful as I could and not overdo it. [I did not want to] lose the lead and hopefully [I would] maintain the lead after the second round. So only doing two high options was my plan and try to be as smooth as possible."

Schatt and Cascartini were second to go and stayed right behind Crolick through both rounds of the class. The duo earned a first round score of 182 followed by the second highest handy round score of 194.5.

"We imported him from Europe in 2019," said Schatt of the Holsteiner gelding. "I started him in the First Year Green right away when he was seven years old. He did well during the summer and then got a skin disease in the fall right where the girth went so he pretty much had all of the fall off because you couldn't put a saddle on him. Last year I started him in the Second Year Greens and then COVID hit, so he has relatively little experience. He is one of those horses that when he is dialed in to what he's supposed to be doing and he's listening to you, he's super brave."

After having difficulties in the last few derby handy rounds that Schatt and Cascartini have done together, the rider wanted to

worked in our favor.”

Currently ranked seventh in the world, Farrington finished the day in third place and expressed his high regard for the impressive work of the two riders finishing ahead of him on the leaderboard.

“I went later in the jump off. These two guys went early and went aggressive to try to win, which I love,” he said. “I think that is great sport. They both had incredible rounds today, and the jump-off was very open which as Jim said, suited a very quick-moving horse which both of their horses are.

“I think this year we saw more European riders than in the past,” he continued. “I think at least five of the top 10 riders in the world are here, which raises everybody’s level. I don’t think there is an easy class to win during the 2021 circuit, so anyone that has won a class here has earned it. It has been a high caliber of horses and great riding; today was no exception. My mare is 15 years old, and I’ve been kind of bringing her back up slowly. She was a little rusty here when she started so I’m glad she’s back in form and she is shortlisted for the Olympics. We’ll see where that goes, but I like to feel like she’s on the upswing again so that’s a good day for us. I thought Adam had an incredible win. I’ve known him and his family a long time. They are great horse people, so hats off to them today.”

Looking ahead, Prudent plans to give his string of horses at least a month off at their farm in Virginia after a busy winter circuit of competitions. For Ifko, the plan is to return to Canada for a much-deserved break as well. With a similar plan to his fellow competitors, Farrington will stay in Wellington a little while longer and give his horses some time off in the Sunshine state.

ESP SPRING SERIES – APRIL 7 TO MAY 16

The 2021 ESP Spring Series will begin April 7, just a few days after the Winter Equestrian Festival ends, and will conclude on May 16 for five weeks of horse shows. The series will incorporate competition at both the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC) and Equestrian Village. New this year, Spring II and Spring III will be internationally rated at the CSI3* level, offering greater prize money as well as opportunities for FEI ranking points. Additionally, both of those weeks will offer hunters the opportunity to compete in the International Ring at PBIEC.

SPRING I: APRIL 7 - 11

All of the classes will be on the main grounds at PBIEC. Featured classes include the \$10,000 National Hunter Derby, presented by Equiline, \$25,000 Premier Equestrian National Grand Prix, and \$35,000 ProElite National Grand Prix.

SPRING II AND III CSI3*: APRIL 14 - 18, APRIL 21 - 25

All hunters and equitation classes will be on the main grounds of PBIEC. The main hunter ring will be the International Ring. Both weeks will host a \$10,000 National Hunter Derby. All jumpers will compete at Equestrian Village. FEI classes and high-level jumpers will be on the grass field. Highlight classes include in Spring II: \$10,000 USHJA National Hunter Derby, presented by Perfect Products, \$35,000 Resilient Fitness Spring 2 National Grand Prix, \$137,000 Bainbridge Companies Grand Prix CSI3*; and in Spring III: \$10,000 USHJA National Hunter Derby, \$35,000 Wellington Agricultural Services Spring 3 National Grand Prix, and \$137,000 Grand Prix CSI3*.

SPRING IV AND V: MAY 6 - 9, MAY 14 - 16

All classes will be at Equestrian Village. Highlight classes include in Spring IV: \$2,500 National Hunter Derby, presented by Score At The Top, \$10,000 Bainbridge Companies Open Stake 1.40m, and \$25,000 Palm Beach Equine Clinic Grand Prix; and in Spring V: \$10,000 Bainbridge Companies Open Stake 1.40m and \$5,000 Omega Alpha 1.35 Classic.

Hunter and Equitation Rider Finish WEF 2021 Strong

The High Performance Hunter division, sponsored by Antares Sellier France, wrapped up on Thursday morning in the E.R. Mische Grand Hunter Ring. Kelley Farmer, of Wellington, FL, piloted Prodigy, owned by Glefke and Oakmont Stables, to the tricolor ribbon after two days of competition. The pair earned two firsts, a second, and two third place ribbons.

"We got him beginning of circuit," explained Farmer. "He was doing some jumpers and Darragh [Kenny] thought maybe he could make a hunter. I started him early in the circuit, and we have shown him a little bit sporadically on and off in the First Year [Green Hunter] and the High Performance [Hunter]. He is a blast to ride because he is careful, has a great canter, and a light mouth. He always tries hard, and I think

he really likes this hunter life. He always gives 110% all the time. I love riding him because you don't have to pick up the reins."

Scott Stewart, of Wellington, FL, and Dr. Betsee Parker's Hudson took home the reserve champion title in the division. Stewart and Hudson received two firsts, two thirds, and a fourth place ribbon.

The Green Hunter 3'9" division, sponsored by Equine Tack and Nutritionals, awarded Geoffrey Hesslink and Trademark the championship honors on Thursday in the E.R. Mische Grand Hunter Ring. Hesslink, of Shelbourne, VT, and Shadowfax Equestrian LLC's Trademark earned 40 points in the division with four first place ribbons and one seventh.

Penny Lombardo and Joyce L. Kutcher's Charismo received reserve champion. Lombardo, of Loxahatchee, FL, piloted Charismo to three seconds, a third, and a fourth place ribbon in the division.

On Saturday, the Amateur-Owner Hunter 3'6" 18-35 division, sponsored by Palm Beach Equine Clinic, came to an end in the E.R. Mische Grand Hunter Ring. Stephanie Danhaki, of Pacific Palisades, CA, rode her own Tufton Avenue to the tricolor ribbon. The duo earned a first, two seconds, a third, and an eighth place ribbon for a total of 26 points.

Not far behind were Callie Seaman and her own Silver Lining who earned the reserve champion title. Seaman, of Greenwich, CT, and her mount took home first, second, fourth, and seventh place ribbons.

On Sunday morning in the Rost Arena, Libbie Gordon, of Statesville, NC, piloted her two mounts High Society and Hamilton to champion and reserve in the Small Junior Hunter 3'6" 16-17. Gordon and her own High Society received 33 points with two firsts, a fourth, and a fifth place ribbon.

Gordon guided her own Hamilton to a total of 19.5 points to earn reserve champion. The duo received a first, second, fourth, fifth, as well as a sixth place ribbon.

On the final day of the WEF 2021 season, Amber Broder and Tip Jar bested a field of fourteen adult equitation riders in the Rost Arena to claim the top prize in the Bruno Delgrange Palm Beach Adult Medal. Tracey Gorin-Byrne and Fiach Byrne Inc.'s Honor Hill's Giovanni were awarded the Bruno Delgrange Palm Beach Adult Medal Series Winners.

Equitation riders were asked to navigate an over fences course and then the top 12 scores returned for a flat phase in the medal. Broder, of Setauket, NY, and Tip Jar, owned by Kimberly Griffiths earned a score of 85 in the first round and moved up two spots in the flat portion to take home the blue ribbon.

"Originally my mom leased him from Don Stewart," explained Broder. "When she got injured over the summer of my freshman year of college I started riding him and fell completely in love with him so my parents told me I could finish out the lease. Then for my 20th birthday that year they surprised me by actually buying him out because I wanted to keep doing the adult equitation."

Lindsey Tomeu, of Wellington, FL, and Sweet Oak Farm's Sunman took home second place in the medal. The pair earned a score of 82 in the first round and moved up five spots in the flat phase. After receiving a first round score of 83, Gorin-Byrne and Honor Hill's Giovanni moved up three places to claim third place honors.

Leading by over 20 points, Gorin-Byrne, of Noank, CT, and Honor Hill's Giovanni earned the Bruno Delgrange Palm Beach Adult Medal Series Winners title.

"I'm really excited," said Gorin-Byrne. "I do a lot of different adult [divisions] and I've always really wanted to win this circuit award and I never have. I was really excited to get that goal accomplished and I'm so proud of my horse and really happy!"

David Blake Blasts Off In \$50,000 Wanderers Club Grand Prix CSI2* to Conclude 2021 WEF

On the final day of the 2021 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF), David Blake (IRL) and Dy Zento, owned by Pine Hollow Farm, put forth a stellar double clear effort on their way to being crowned victorious in the \$50,000 Wanderers Club Grand Prix CSI2* on Sunday, April 4.

In the feature class on Sunday morning, a total of 44 pairs represented the starting field as course designer Olaf Petersen Jr. (GER) set an impressive 1.45m track. Just five horse-and-rider combinations from the first half of the class qualified for the jump-off while another 10 pairs were added to the list from the second half. In the end, an exciting group of 15 set to return represented seven different nations.

Kevin Mealiff (IRL) and Tupac Van De Vrombautshoeve Z, owned by Oakmont Stables, LLC, set a new leading time of 44.05 seconds in the jump-off. Mealiff and the 11-year-old Zangersheide gelding by Thunder VD Zuuthoeve would hold the lead through the next few pairs until Blake and Dy Zento returned.

Blake and the 13-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding by Zento x Goodtimes zipped around the track, opening up their stride for a long gallop down to the final fence on course. The pair managed to leave all the jumps in their cups in an impressive time of 42.93 seconds, a time that would hold for top spot in the end.

"I've taken it slow with him the last couple of years," said Blake of the gelding he has been riding for four years. "We haven't done a whole lot with him, but we

built him up for the early circuit, and it all came together today, so it was worth the wait.

"He has a lot of blood," continued Blake. "The jump-off really suited him today because he's a big horse, so it really suited his stride and the run down to the last jump, I feel like I was quicker than anyone else there. For a big horse, he's got a lot of blood and he's very athletic, so it makes it easier in the ring."

Blake noted that he has had a slower circuit than normal with fewer horses in his string to campaign. With that in mind, his grand prix win gives him a little extra motivation for what is to come this summer.

"It was really nice to get the win today and end the winter on a high note," he said. "It was a really exciting finish and feels very rewarding. We're going to stay in Wellington to do the two

three-star shows on the grass Derby Field during the ESP Spring Series before we head up north. I'm really looking forward to jumping on the grass and giving the horses a little bit of something different here."

Peter Lutz (USA) rounded out the top three finishers with a double-clear effort aboard Hollerno, owned by Lutz/Manfredi Show Jumping and LMW Sporthorses. He and the nine-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding by Baltic VDL x Ahorn stopped the timers at 44.47 seconds.

A: My favorite memory was the Great Charity Challenge. For the theme 'Heroes' my team dressed up in Clorox, toilet paper, and Pirelli costumes. Even just walking the course that day was so much fun!

make sure to give the gelding a confident and positive ride. Schatt navigated a slick track, and Cascartini jumped in beautiful form to hold onto the pair's second place position.

"Today I really wanted to try to win the class," said Schatt, "but at the same time I wanted to give him the best experience that I could give him because he has had trouble in the handy the last couple classes. I feel like as a rider with that horse at that stage of the game, I did everything I could to try to gain some points on Greg, which I did gain a few points but not enough."

After a win on the field yesterday, Boyd returned today ready to give it her all. The rider guided Cassico to a classic round score of 177 in the first round to put them in third place. After a more "jumpery" school with Boyd's brother, Hardin Towell, the pair produced an impressive handy round performance for the second-highest handy score of 195.

"I'm thrilled with him," said Boyd of the 10-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Carrico. "He's owned by Rebekah Warren, so he's been doing the 3'3" Amateur-[Owners] all season. He's such a good boy to step right up and do this class. It was a fun class. I thought that the trot in to the two-stride was a nice addition, and it was just a fun way to end circuit galloping on a field.

"My dad Jack [Towell] was training the junior hunters today so my brother Hardin came over," continued Boyd. "The schooling was a little different than we usually do. I felt like we were getting ready for the five star!"

With some of the top hunter combinations entered in the class, Crolick was thrilled to finish the season with a big victory.

"It feels wonderful for this big of a win," said Crolick. "You keep plugging along, and you're always on the hunt. You hope, and some days are good, some days are bad. Today was absolutely wonderful. I'm really happy for the client and my sponsors. It takes a huge team to do this. I just want to thank clients, sponsors, grooms, and everybody that goes into it."

Elizabeth Towell Boyd and Carento Can't Be Caught in the \$15,000 USHJA International Derby "Hunt and Go"

Hunter competition once again took the spotlight on the Derby Field at Equestrian Village on Friday. Thirty-four of the top hunter horse-and-rider combinations entered the \$15,000 USHJA International Derby "Hunt and Go" for their chance to win the top prize. With impressive performances in both the classic round and handy portion, Elizabeth Towell Boyd and Sherri Crawford's Carento earned the victory in the class with an overall score of 351.

The class was held in a "Hunt and Go" format, with the first eight fences counting towards the classic round and then the final six jumps being the handy phase. Ken Krome designed a technical course including four high option fences, a trot jump, and a "bounce" element. Riders were also asked to walk a circle in between the classic and handy phases.

First in the order of go, Boyd, of Camden, SC, and Carento set the pace with a classic round score of 173 and a handy round score of 178. The duo held onto the top spot throughout the remainder of the competitive class. Boyd is no stranger to this hunter derby and also earned a first place finish in 2019 aboard Tradition.

"I really studied the course, and all the riders and I talked," explained Boyd. "I like how Ken Krome broke it up and let us walk a complete loop, and I

think for the rider and the horse that was nice. I felt [Carento] take a deep breath, I took a deep breath, and then we were able to think about the handy and it gave us a minute to rock back on our hind end and reorganize. I hope for the future that is something course designers continue to do. I think it's nice for the judges [too]. It gives them a minute, and it gives the riders and horses a minute."

Despite the challenges of being first to go, Boyd and the 15-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Caretino navigated around the difficult course with ease. Boyd knew that she could trust her seasoned partner to step up to the plate and enjoy competing on the field.

"He is just so made up and has had so many miles, so this is a great venue for him," described Boyd. "It was to my advantage that the weather changed and it was a little cool and shadowy because he is such a seasoned derby horse that nothing really scares him. What I liked is that he just picked up a gallop and stayed loose with a nice long rein. He went very hunter-style and made a great effort, didn't touch a jump, and was so smooth. It was really fun, and when he is like that he's easy to ride."

"Sherri Crawford is a wonderful owner," continued Boyd. "She flats him and trail rides him, and I think that her and Kitty Barker have done a really good job managing an older horse. The hardest thing when they get older, a little bit like a Brunello situation, is to really keep them happy and don't get greedy and show too much. We waited and asked him to peak this week, and he did."

This was an emotional victory for Boyd, who dedicated the win to her head groom, Alberto Ramirez.

"My head groom who has been with us for 20 years and took care of Brunello was diagnosed with Leukemia yesterday, so I really rode for Alberto today," said Boyd. "We don't ever do derbies without him so I rode for him today to make him proud."

Not far behind in points were Jennifer Hannan, of Wakefield, RI, and her own Olympic Fire who took home second place. The pair received a score of 169.25 in the classic round, a score of 177.50 in the handy phase, and an overall score of 346.75. Third place honors went to Boyd on her second mount Cassico, owned by Rebekah Warren, with a total score of 345.85. The pair earned a score of 169.85 in the first round and a handy score of 176.

On the opening day of the final week of the 2021 Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF), Kristen Vanderveen (USA) and Bull Run's Faustino De Tili, owned by Bull Run Jumpers Five, LLC, flew to a winning finish in the \$10,000 Douglas Elliman Real Estate 1.45m Jumpers CSI4* on Wednesday.

Just ninth in the starting order, Vanderveen and the 16-year-old Belgian Warmblood stallion by Berlin x Darco, flew around the second phase, leaving all the jumps up in a time of 21.92 seconds, fast enough to hold the lead until the end.

Canada's Tiffany Foster and Brighton, a 15-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding by Contender II x Quick Star, owned by Artisan Farms, LLC, finished in second place with a clear effort in 23.46 seconds. It was also a podium finish for Israel as Daniel Bluman guided Colestina H, an 11-year-old German Sport Horse mare by Colestus x Cardenio 2, for Blue Star Investments and Kim Douglas to a third-place finish in a time of 24.30 seconds.

To open Wednesday, Kevin Mealiff (IRL) and Bel Star, owned by Whiterock Farm, Ltd, captured the blue ribbon in the \$6,000 1.40m Jumpers CSI2*. Mealiff and the 10-year-old Selle Français gelding by Untouchable M completed the jump-off portion of the two-phase course with a clear effort in 25.12 seconds.

Following that, fellow Irishman Jordan Coyle piloted Warnike, an 11-year-old Dutch Sport Horse mare by Eldorado Vd Zeshoek x Vingino owned by Elan Farm, won the \$1,000 Bainbridge Companies 1.40m CSI4* with a double clear effort in 26.40 seconds.

Brian Moggre (USA) put forth a stellar double-clear effort aboard MTM Vivre Le Reve, owned by Major Wager, LLC, to capture the \$50,000 Adequan® WEF Challenge Cup Round 12 on Thursday.

First to return for the jump-off, Nayel Nassar (EGY) paved the way for the rest of pack as he and Lucifer V, a 15-year-old Westphalian gelding by Lord Dezi x Grandeur owned by Evergate Stables, LLC, put forth a clear effort in 40.32 seconds.

Germany's Daniel Deusser and Casallvano, a 12-year-old Holsteiner gelding by Casall x Silvana owned by Camilla Hamann and Philipp Widmayer, posted a clear effort but finished just off the leading time in 40.56 seconds for third place.

Second last to go, Moggre and the 12-year-old Westphalian gelding by Ustinov x Chello II, gave it their best shot. The risky plan paid off as Moggre and his longtime partner "Erkel" added their own double-clear to the leaderboard with the quickest time of the day, crossing the timers in 40.04

seconds.

It was another victory for Shane Sweetnam (IRL) and Indra Van De Oude Heihoef owned by The Blue Buckle Group, at WEF, this time in the \$73,000 CaptiveOne Advisors 1.50m Classic Series Final on Friday.

Adrienne Sternlicht (USA) and Bennys Legacy owned by Starlight Farms, LLC, moved into the lead, stopping the clock at 37.60 seconds. In the end, the 27-year-old rider would land in third position aboard the 13-year-old Oldenburg gelding by Lupicor x Acordia.

Following Sternlicht, the door was left open just a crack and one of the world's fastest Irishmen seized the opportunity. Sweetnam and Indra Van De Oude Heihoef, a 13-year-old Belgian Warmblood mare by Casantos x Action-Breaker, who shaved nearly a full second off the leading time to take over top spot in 35.56 seconds.

Last to go, Eugenio Garza Perez (MEX) and Armani SL Z owned by El Milagro, gave it their best shot and came close. The 24-year-old rider piloted his 13-year-old Zangersheide stallion by Asca Z x Cumano to a second-place finish in a time of 35.70 seconds, less than two-tenths of a second off the leading pace.

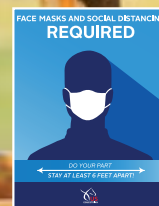
