HOW MANY LIVES DO YOU SERVE ANNUALLY: We are currently serving approximately 35,000 of the 200,000 students in Palm Beach County Public Schools through our programs.

HOW MANY LIVES DO YOU EXPECT TO ASSIST WITH THIS GRANT: We are estimating that with your generous support we will be able to reach approximately 50,000 of the 200,000 students in Palm Beach County Public Schools. We will continue to work toward the goal of serving EVERY student in our schools.

PLEASE GIVE US A DETAILED EXPLANATION OF HOW THE FUNDS RECEIVED WILL BE UTILIZED:

We are planning to use the funds from the Great Charity Challenge to Support the items listed below. Please note that these are estimated amounts and final amounts may vary, however, the funds will support what we've detailed in our plan.

1. Red Apple Supplies (RAS):

Estimated Amount \$12,000

- Our plan is to hire a Part Time Support Staff as soon as possible that will be able to help us with further expanding our immense growth since starting this program less than two years ago. In doing so we would be able to serve additional schools, teachers, and students in the county. We currently have one full time staff member, our Red Apple Supplies Manager that runs the entire operation of RAS on his own, with the support of volunteers. Having a part time support staff will greatly help us build capacity and increase our ability to serve the needs of the Schools, Teachers, and Students who most needs support.
- Find information regarding this program below:
 - The 2017-2018 school year has gotten off to a tremendous start! The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County (EFPBC) is excited to have successfully completed its second calendar year (2017) of a free school supply and resource store, called Red Apple Supplies (RAS), serving Palm Beach County public schools. This resource store provides teachers free supplies throughout the school year for their economically disadvantaged students attending schools designated as Title 1 (based on the school's percentage of free/reduced price lunch eligible students). To meet the most urgent need in our district as quickly as possible, RAS currently targets schools where over 95% of the children receive free meals;



our long-term goal is to serve all public schools across the entire county where 70% or more of the children receive free and reduced lunch.

We planned for Red Apple Supplies to be serving 28 of the 33 schools that have a 95% and above Free and Reduced Lunch rate in the 2017-2018 school year. This year we have already met that goal. To date, 32 schools shop at Red Apple Supplies (RAS). 14 schools are registered as full shops, 17 schools are registered as one-rep shops, and we have one school that we conduct mobile distribution or pop up shops for due to their location. We have had 187 teachers participate in 254 shops reaching approximately 15,000 students already this year as of December 19, 2017 and we originally projected when we submitted our application this fall that we would serve closer to 13,000 students.

To date, over \$160,000.00 in supplies (value of supplies) has been distributed to teachers and students in Palm Beach County Schools through Red Apple Supplies this school year alone, and we have the rest of the school year to go!

We've had 162 volunteers who have donated 715 volunteer hours since August 1 of this year thru January 6, 2018 and those numbers are steadily increasing as we get additional requests to volunteer at Red Apple Supplies for the spring.

We planned on having a "Pop-Up" shop in Belle Glade, in the heart of the Glades community, the last week in September 2017 where we planned to bring Red Apple Supplies to the Glades, which is one of the most challenged areas in Palm Beach County. Due to Hurricane Irma, we did a mobile distribution instead, where we delivered over \$52,000 in school supplies to some of the schools and areas that were hardest hit by the hurricane. These schools also served as shelter schools or FEMA sites during the storm.

This year we planned to expand the number of supply drives in the community to increase our inventory at Red Apple Supplies. Last year we had 26 successful supply drives. This year we have already had 49 successful supply drives and have partnered with the Palm Beach North Chamber of Commerce Education Committee who is hosting a supply drive for us in January 2018. We will continue to work with the community to plan additional supply drives throughout this year.

2. GoTeach! Classroom Grants:

Estimated Amount: \$55,000

- Through your support we will be able to fund our innovative classroom grant program fully or partially for the 2018-2019 school year depending on the number of applicants received. We have the opportunity to use your funds to apply for a matching grant provided by the Consortium of Florida Education Foundations (CFEF). In doing so, we will be able to serve more teachers and support innovation and creativity in the classroom in order to improve teacher quality and student achievement through STEM Education, Improving Reading, Math, etc...

Teachers who apply for classroom grants share that they struggle to secure funding to create special projects that promote interactive learning among their students. They want to bring ideas and exploration into the classroom environment, encouraging more critical thinking and problem-solving approaches to learning. Even the youngest students needing encouragement in reading and other basic skills benefit from the personalized approach that only a teacher can design based on his or her students and their individual learning styles.

Grant reports consistently tell us these projects increase student interest and performance as expected. Additionally, teachers stress the need to propose projects that fund specific materials, equipment or instruments students need when other funds do not allow such expenses. These independent and often innovative classroom grants can enrich a teacher's required curriculum or provide the avenue for entirely new classroom approaches or pilot projects.

The Education Foundation of Palm Beach County GoTeach! Classroom Grants encourage educators to create innovative and exciting educational opportunities for their students. GoTeach! Grants focus on these priority areas: Literacy, Career Education and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics). The typical GoTeach! Grant ranges from \$275 for individual teacher proposals to \$1,275 for team proposals. Once the grant application is submitted it is reviewed by the Education Foundation's board members and other community leaders. Classroom grants are awarded in the fall, and grantees are required to submit results, photos, and a summary of how the funds were used at the end of the school year.

The grants and the proposal process itself are evaluated annually for providing effective learning projects to our students. Not only are the grants assessed for educational impact, but grant access and participation are also addressed.

In recognition of teachers and their extraordinary effort to bring exciting knowledge and projects to their students, GoTeach! Classroom Grants are awarded in a presentation where teachers are applauded among their peers and administrative leaders. This new event was very meaningful to our teachers, as the ceremony provided a venue for the community to show its appreciation for our educators.

Here are a few examples of the GoTeach! Classroom Program Highlights/Project Descriptions for the 2017-2018 school year:

Project Name: Creative Cookbook

<u>Project Summary:</u> "Creative Cookbook" will provide special needs students with hands-on learning opportunities to gain Science, Math, and Language/Literacy enrichment. This will be accomplished by following recipes in the "Creative Cookbook" and creating their own edible treats.

<u>Program Updates</u>: "The Creative Cookbook is turning out to be an amazing experience for my students and for me as an educator! The joy that I am seeing on my students faces makes me feel so grateful that I am able to provide these hands-on lessons for my students. We are integrating every subject, especially literacy in each lesson by building vocabulary, the love of reading, and creating a purpose for writing. In a short time, I am



already noticing that my students are putting thoughts into sentences with more ease as they write about the cooking projects. They are also recalling vocabulary and American Sign Language (ASL) as the same utensils or materials are needed, such as a large spoon, mixing bowl and egg. As of this time, I have not purchased the materials needed to put the cookbooks together, but I will be doing that soon. I am creating power point presentations to go along with all of my lessons and I am thinking about printing them out to include in the cookbooks in order to provide written English vocabulary with real photographs, as well as including some of the ASL. We will continue to create one recipe per month, unless I am able to include an additional one or two. I am confident that the students will continue to embrace these experiences and that their families will be thrilled to see their final projects in the spring". Stacey Greenberg (teacher)

Project Name: Little Einsteins

<u>Project Summary:</u> "Little Einsteins" will give young students the opportunity to explore, design, build, collaborate in teams, and challenge themselves to think deeper, through the use of a S.T.E.M. Center.

Project Name: Pet Wellness Leads to Career Readiness

<u>Project Summary:</u> "Pet Wellness Leads to Career Readiness" will allow students to conduct wellness checks on animals brought in for pet washes by expanding the pet-wash area within South Tech Academy's existing career academy. This would include a patient intake area where students can use general veterinary clinical equipment to role play patient evaluations on pets.

Project Name: Using ELISA to Save the Giant Pandas

<u>Project Summary:</u> "Using ELISA to Save the Giant Pandas" will provide students in Biotechnology classes opportunities to expand their knowledge of ELISA (Enzyme-Linked ImmunoSorbant Assay). Students will get additional practice in using an antibody/antigen test to understand the use, and applications of, the ELISA in the Biotechnology workplace.

Project Name: We All STEAM for Ice Cream

<u>Project Summary:</u> "We ALL STEAM for Ice Cream" will provide students the opportunity to develop a school-based enterprise in the form of a frozen dessert bar. This project will demonstrate how to establish an innovative small business model that will assist students in gaining career skills and solutions, to the challenges they face in becoming capable members of the future.

Project Name: Improving Environmental Awareness and Functional Skills

Among Students with Autism Through Science and Math

<u>Project Summary</u>: "Improving Environmental Awareness and Functional Skills Among Students with Autism Through Science and Math" will provide students opportunities to develop awareness about nature and preservation, by growing an eco-friendly organic garden and caring for it in a responsible way.

Project Name: Climbing the Ladder to Literacy: One Step at a Time

Project Summary: "Climbing the Ladder to Literacy: One Step at a Time" will help students, especially those



with fine and gross motor impairments, to develop literacy skills through the use of technology, by using IPads, Adobe Connect Software, and specialized learning apps which will be customized for each student.

3. We are in the process of creating a new program that we would like to start this year in partnership with the District that would support over 4,300 students in Palm Beach County Public Schools who are homeless. In addition, this program would support students in foster care and children of migrant farm workers. All of these children are receiving a free education, however, these students aren't able to participate in extra-curricular activities due to cost of uniforms, field trips, registration fees, etc...With your support, this new program we are developing would provide students the financial support that is essential in order to participate in sports, art, music, Student Government, and other enrichment activities that will give them invaluable opportunities to succeed outside of the classroom, ultimately enhancing their educational experiences.

By attending trainings in event planning, marketing, development, grant writing, leadership, we will be able to stay current in nonprofit leadership and management which will allow us to improve and perfect our skillset and craft for our staff of 6, soon to be 7 if we can hire a part time staff for Red Apple Supplies.

The Family Care Program makes Quantum House home. The Family Care Program is a comprehensive program including Family Housing Subsidy, Family Pantry, Chef for a Day, Family Engagement Program and Family Crisis Fund all help families handle such a hectic time.

Your gift will continue to make the House a place *where hope has a home*® for hundreds of families and allow it to accomplish its goals:



- 1. To decrease added financial burden for parents by providing affordable housing and household essentials during a child's treatment
- 2. To increase time families spend together by having families as close as possible, providing opportunities for bonding at meal times and during other family activities
- 3. To increase opportunities for children and their siblings to be engaged in learning and play for children amid a medical crisis

Baby Maggie arrived early and needed to be monitored for weeks because of four separate heart defects. Thinking about what it would cost to stay in a hotel near the hospital, Maggie's mom said, "that would damn near break us." The Family Housing Subsidy lifted that burden. The House requests a donation of \$40 per night, but no family is ever turned away for an inability to pay. Every child deserves the opportunity to have their family as close as possible.

Parents don't have to worry about purchasing, planning and preparing a hot, nutritious meal. The Chef for a Day Program hosts hundreds of volunteer groups every year as they serve families dinner almost every single night. On evenings when a group is unavailable, the Family Pantry Program makes sure a meal is still available. Families have the chance to gather around the dinner table together. The Family Pantry Program also ensures household essentials like linens, laundry detergent, paper towels and other pantry staples are always available.

Family Engagement Program lets kids be kids. It emphasizes learning and play to make sure school-aged children keep up with their academics and there are plenty of positive distractions from what goes on at the hospital.

Families manage as best they can with the ups and downs and setbacks that come with a child's medical treatment schedule. Sometimes, though, families are just making it after a devastating medical crisis. In those cases, the Family Crisis Fund is the answer to critical needs that can be as simple as a tank of gas to get back home or help with funeral costs.

TechGarage Programs

TechGarage operates year round team-based competitive robotics programs. In the fall our students form teams, build and program robots and drones, and compete in the robot drone league. In the spring students have a choice or joining our Virtual Reality League, or depending on their age; form teams to build MATE or SeaPerch underwater robots. Additionally our high school students compete in the FIRST First Robotics Competition. During the summer we operate a 4-week technology camp at the FAU high school and this year, for the first time, will host a 2-week technology summer camp for at-risk students at the Westgate community center in partnership with the Palm Beach County Sheriff PAL program.

Funds from this GCC grant will be used to; (i) start a robotics camp at the Westgate community center for at-risk students (ii) start and expand competitive robotics teams in low income neighborhoods in central and southern Palm Beach county, and (iii) provide scholarships for at-risk students to attend FAU High advanced robotics summer camp (iv) Support hiring of minority FAU Engineering students who will be Robotics coaches/Mentors for at-risk robotics teams.

Expand Programs: We currently have vibrant and active robotics programs with Boca Raton's Housing Authority the Pearl City CATS after-school program and with the Palm Beach county Sheriff Police Athletic League (PAL) in West Palm Beach. We will expand our PAL program to include more students in the year-round robotics program and for them to attend the FAU High robotics summer camp. Additionally, we can now sponsor a robotics team of at-risk girls who live in a HUD housing project to attend FAU High robotics summer camp and start their own year-round robotics team.

New Programs: Many students in the underserved communities in Palm Beach County do not have access technology programs to help them learn science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) concepts. Our goal is to introduce and support the competitive robotics program for at-risk students in as many low-income community centers as possible. Last year we partnered with the STEM academy at Royal Palm Beach High School and provided them with parts and equipment to compete in the robot drone league in the fall. We will now target and provide robotics programming to the community centers in the neighborhoods near the elementary and middle schools that feed into the Royal Palm Beach High School. Our goal is to inspire more minority students in the area to become sufficiently interested in technology so they'll elect the STEM academy in high school thereby putting them on a path to an engineering career. Additionally, we have partnership commitments from the Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation department as well as from the city of Delray Beach to provide our project and challenge based robotics program to community centers in unincorporated Palm Beach county and Delray Beach.

For both the new program and the program expansion, TechGarage will use the funds to purchase equipment; robot kits, drones, supplies and to pay FAU engineering students hired as robotics coaches for the competitive robotics programs which will be started in the at-risk community centers. We hire FAU engineering students from the Society of Black Engineers and the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers to provide students with mentors who are from similar socio-economic backgrounds as themselves and will be more understanding of their everyday challenges, encourage them to persevere and demonstrate why college matters. These college students view this as a work-study opportunity as it allows them to work in their field and mentor the next generation. We are cost conscious and purchase parts that are easily reusable for different competitions, are interchangeable among teams, and can be reused in subsequent years to make different types of robots.

These funds will allow TechGarage to further expand our reach to at-risk students in underserved neighborhoods thereby helping us to fulfill our mission of developing self-sustainable models for educational robotics programs that engage young minds in building STEM skills, while simultaneously inspiring innovation and creativity. This will provide us with an opportunity to have a greater impact in the at-risk community and enable students to work collaboratively in a team environment so they can foster well-rounded life capabilities, including self-confidence, communication, and leadership.

We would like to use 20% of our funds to be allocated towards our children's ministry to help build our library content, to upgrade our computers and software such as Microsoft Office and other educational programs for children of all ages, to build our community garden, and to continue to invest in our staff with proper trainings geared towards helping our children in all aspects. 25% of our funds would go towards our Food Pantry to replace outdated appliances that are no longer working efficiently, to develop a more efficient recording system, and to ensure that we have quality food for those in need. 52% of the funds will be designated for Wellness and Healthcare navigation which will assist us with providing salaries for well qualified staff members to assist and help our clients with case management. It will also assist us in helping our homeless and disabled clients with transportation needs to and from doctors' appointments. 3% will be spent to improve True Fast communications strategy related to brand, awareness, education and fundraising.

PLEASE GIVE US A DETAILED EXPLANATION OF HOW THE FUNDS RECEIVED WILL BE UTILIZED:

Your generous gift will be used to fund Alzheimer's Community Care's Family Nurse Consultant Program in Wellington. The Family Nurse Consultant brings comfort and support to patients and caregivers in crisis and throughout the disease process, with no-cost to families.

Very often, a family's first contact with the Family Nurse Consultant is through Alzheimer's Community Care's 24-Hour Alzheimer's Crisis Line. Perhaps the patient has wandered or something has changed in the patient's behavior. Oftentimes the caregiver has simply reached the point where s/he can no longer manage the illness alone. This call for help sets in motion a coordinated response that comforts the family member and gets much needed individualized services to the Alzheimer's patient.

Family Nurse Consultants are licensed nurses with extensive training and education in dementia-specific services. The nurse meets with family caregivers and patients in their homes where they are able to see firsthand the existing challenges and opportunities. Alzheimer's patients, for example, are at great risk for falls. The untrained eye may overlook dangers, but the Family Nurse Consultant, as a trained professional, knows what to look for and how to modify the environment to enhance safety and simplify daily routines. Family Nurse Consultants evaluate the needs of **both** the patient and caregiver and develop individualized care plans for services that will support a patient's dignity and provide relief for the caregiver. Very often, the Alzheimer's patient is referred to one of Alzheimer's Community Care's Specialized Alzheimer's Day Care Centers. (Alzheimer's Community Care's Day Care Center in Wellington is located on the campus of St. Michael's Lutheran Church at 1925 Birkdale Drive.) Staffed by dementia-care specialists, the centers bring the Alzheimer's patient out of isolation and into a caring environment that includes medication administration, health monitoring, nutritious meals, and cognitive stimulation. The caregiver also receives much needed respite from the ongoing stress of balancing their needs and those of other family members with the needs of the Alzheimer's patient. Caregivers are also referred to professionally led Caregiver Support Groups where they receive peer-support and learn practical coping strategies for dealing with day-to-day struggles. They soon discover that they are not alone and as they emerge from isolation, they soon provide hope and support to others.

The Family Nurse Consultant often recommends Alzheimer's Community Care's ID Locator Bracelet Service that provides state-of-the art technology to track and quickly locate an Alzheimer's patient who wanders and becomes lost. This lifesaving technology is a critical tool for law enforcement as time is critical in these situations. Eighty percent of those who wander and are not found within 72 hours will not survive the event. In addition to equipping patients with tracking bracelets, the Family Nurse Consultant works with families on strategies to reduce the chances of patient wandering through an increased understanding and management of patient behaviors.

The Family Nurse Consultant remains with the patient and family throughout the course of the illness that averages 8-10 years, but can last up to 20 years. The nurse is the constant through the ever-changing stages of the illness. Families quickly come to rely on the wisdom, support and compassion provided. Because Alzheimer's disease manifests itself differently in each individual, it is important that a dementia specialist, such as the Family Nurse Consultant, is present to monitor the health and cognition of patient and guide the family each step of the way. The nurse also places a particular focus on reducing the stress that often accompanies the burden of caring for a loved-one with Alzheimer's disease. This service is delaying or eliminating the need for costly nursing home placement as well as reducing Emergency Room and doctor's



office visits. The financial impact is significant, but more importantly families are able to continue living together with dignity and safety throughout the disease progression.

Because Medicare and traditional insurances do not pay for this service, the program is entirely supported by grants and donations. Your generous support assures that no family in Wellington, caring for a loved one with dementia, has to take the Alzheimer's journey alone.

Youth Services at Gulfstream Goodwill (GGI-YS) is designed to ensure that we are reaching and providing services to vulnerable youth from throughout Palm Beach County during three critical stages: (1) prevention of violence and justice-system involvement through our *Good Leaders* high school program, (2) during court-involvement when alternative sanctions to detention can be accessed through our *Alternatives to Secure Detention* program, and (3) at the time of community reentry after a period of detention in our *Back to a Future* program. Our three programs serve an average of 200 youth per year.

The College/Vocational School exploration component will serve a minimum of 10 youth who are interested in attending post-secondary training prior to entering the workforce. Youth and their parent(s), caregivers, mentors and advocates will be encouraged to participate in the program and join the tours in order to support the aspirations of their youth participants.

To participate in this project youth must be enrolled in school or working to complete their GED, or have already earned their GED or High School diploma, if in school they must maintain acceptable attendance and grade progress, and participate actively in achieving the goals established on their Personal Development Plan. The project will leverage the support of the existing youth Case Managers at GGI to ensure progress is being made.



Youth Services at GGI (GGI-YS) will utilize funds from the Great Charity Challenge to support the on-going work of the programs in the youth department through a College/Vocational School exploration component that would;

- Provide family education regarding post-secondary opportunities for youth and the positive impacts on the youth and family,

If the child/family remains in treatment, they receive a treatment plan dictated by the goals and objectives that the child/family wishes to work on, thus making the desired results much more attainable. These services are provided to the child and family at the child's school and/or home, or at the location that the family identifies. The goal is to step in early, when there are signs and symptoms that a child is exhibiting behaviors that interfere with normal functioning at home, at school and in the community. This early intervention can mean the difference between ongoing mental or behavioral health issues that can hinder school, family and life success. This program increases service accessibility, reduces duplication, and maximizes resources, so that timely and appropriate interventions can positively change a child's life trajectory.

The Centers provide a holistic and comprehensive family support program for over 600 families that includes but is not limited to; preventative health care, developmental and behavioral health screenings, case management parenting, financial, nutrition and ESOL classes, assistance with accessing economic assistance, housing, transportation and jobs, all in an effort to ensure that our children go home to safe, healthy and stable families, that positively contribute to our workforce and community.

Through the FFCDC's programs, we can bridge the achievement gap so prevalent among children from low-income, primarily minority families.

FFCDC is proud to be able provide its families through the support of our funding partners, access to the quality care and educational preparation their children so desperately need yet cannot afford. Programs offered to them include the following:



- Infant and Toddler Care, in which nurturing caregivers engage them in the play, social, and verbal interactions essential for development of their cognitive and motor skills. This is a critical need for single working poor in the community because of the high cost of child care.
- Early Childhood Education, providing the educational foundation essential for success in kindergarten. FFCDC is the only Head Start and Early Head Start programs in Boca Raton. Clients are victims or vulnerable to exploitation, abuse and/or neglect; and in most cases, suffer from a cognitive impairment. The mission of the Junior League of Boca Raton's Community Garden is to cultivate the spirit of community and enhance quality of life by creating and sustaining an organic garden of vegetables, flowers, plants, and trees.

The funds received will be used as follows:

- To further develop the Food Forest, we require more fruit bearing foliage, trees, herbs and vegetables plants. Permaculture shows us that if we design using observation and bio-mimicry of nature, land can be restored to an abundance that supports all living things. We will install SmartGarden Pods, which utilize aeroponic technology to grow produce crops up to three times more quickly compared to traditional soil. The plants grow with roots suspended in air and are periodically sprayed with water and nutrients. (\$3,000)
- To install solar powered lighting, an environmentally friendly technology; which will deliver a dependable and autonomous power solution. This will enable us to increase light output in the evening hours, so that we may hold more events in the garden. The main focus of the lighting will be directed to pathways within the garden. We have two upcoming events in the Community Garden (Dr. Seuss' Birthday Party and an Earth Day celebration), which will take place in the morning & afternoon hours; however, we would like to offer family-friendly events in the evening as well. (\$10,000)
- To beautify the garden and create an inviting green space for the community to enjoy. The project will include a big trellis and flowers, which will be placed in the southwest part of the garden; and an irrigation system. A mini sensory garden will be placed in the wildflower walk and northeast part of the garden. The sensory garden will offer durable recycled materials with the purpose of stimulating the senses and benefit both children and adults. (\$4,000)

To operate a dedicated wildlife rescue vehicle on a 24/7 basis. The vehicle includes rescue gear, protective clothing, tranquilizing and medical equipment, and cages.

Rescue specialists who are trained in wildlife rescue techniques. These specialists are on-call at all-times; they respond to weekend and nighttime calls for rescue.

Hospital facilities, including surgery, ICU, and quarantine ward.

Rehabilitation complex to handle large and small mammals, large and small birds, water birds, and reptiles. Rehabilitation may take from several weeks to a year or more. Animals in rehabilitation must be shielded from general public to facilitate an easier re-introduction to the wild.

Feeding of 400 animals monthly during their treatment and rehabilitation.

Maintaining facilities for natural habitat housing of about 250 animals whose injuries or condition preclude them from being released to the wild. These animals are used in wildlife education programs, the Sanctuary's second mission

Thanks to the grant we received from the Ziegler Family Foundation last year, we were able to partner with The American Parkinson Association and the Hospice organization serving rural Okeechobee County which brought the total number of organizations who can provide the Powerful Tools for Caregiver workshops to six, which certainly leverages the geographic reach of the Agency.

As a continuation to the funding we received from the Ziegler Family Foundation last year, with this year's grant we plan to initiate two important service areas:

1) Extend the services we provide to caregivers by providing an educational support group component to those that attend the Powerful Tools for Caregiver Workshops. Topics in this component will include financial and budgeting education, tools on how to meet the legal and medical considerations of caregiving as well as providing the emotional support needed.

We plan to implement this concept in partnership with other local service organizations by integrating their existing caregiving services into the support group concept. The funding will be used to support the follow on educational component.

2) This new funding will assist us in training and certifying three community health workers who, in partnership with local community organizations, will serve the senior population as well as disabled adults

In working with the populations we serve, we are aware that many suffer from malnutrition, isolation and depression. Training these health workers will allow us to send them into the community to provide a direct contact and assist seniors to improve their nutritional level which in turn will improve their health outcomes; screen them and engage them in a program designed to address their mental health, depression and anxiety; connect them with group settings that will focus on providing workshops such as fall prevention, diabetes self-management, pain and stress management etc.



These community health workers will also have the ability to assist seniors and adults with disabilities with medication management and connecting directly to services such as dental and eye care even to those without insurance or the ability to pay.

The primary goal of TLA is to prepare each student it serves to succeed in life by providing academic, social/emotional, physical and spiritual enrichment through these students' formative years. Last year, 92% of students who regularly attended TLA made gains in their reading abilities.
- SMART Program, where Science Meets Art, serves students in grades K-8 through in depth programming by trained staff in the sciences, visual arts and performing arts fields. The primary goal of SMART is to prepare each student it serves to realize their potential gifting and affinity towards a subject through providing exposure to the arts and sciences. Unfortunately, most of the schools where the youth we serve attend find the funding for these vital areas of creativity and knowledge cut first. These funds will be used primarily to address our increasing requests for meal subsidy dollars from our homebound seniors. MOWPB clients all pay a little something for each meal. At full price they are paying \$6.00 per meal, but some, in greater financial distress, will pay as little as \$0.50 per meal – all based on a sliding scale reflecting their household income. Since our inception in 2010 we have maintained approximately 30% of our clients paying the full amount, and the rest at various levels of subsidy. This past year that number shifted significantly to only 12% able to pay the full amount, leaving 88% needing financial assistance. We had not projected that in our annual budget, so funding to cover that need is vital. With \$10,000 of the GCC grant being applied to subsidy, we can provide at least 3,300 meals to the neediest of our homebound seniors.

We expect to use \$5,000 or less to purchase materials including new hot/cold packs for our delivery bags to maintain safe food temperatures. The ones that we have currently are old and are in need of replacement. Additionally, we will buy two commercial microwaves.

Strengthening the family to assist them through their trauma helps them to cope and plan for a violence-free future.

This program is unique - the horses are the teachers and the barn is a classroom. The lessons at the farm follow the educational standards set out by the Palm Beach County Board of Education for this age group and include; a) participate in individual and group recreational activities b) complete routines and tasks according to instructions and expectations c) sequence multiple tasks by establishing a routine, follow a schedule, prioritizing tasks d) follow rules and procedures across multiple locations e) demonstrate the ability to adjust to new routines and changes in tasks, settings and locations.
