# **GRAVES, PERRY-GLASS, AND LYLE**SWEEP THE FREESTYLE COMPETITION AT AGDF WEEK 8

The eighth week of the AGDF, the Palm Beach Dressage Derby, featured CDI-W and CDI-3\* competition on February 28 - March 3. The "Friday Night Stars" featured both the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle also presented by Havensafe Farm.

Laura Graves (USA) rode Verdades to a score of 84.535% to win the freestyle and to secure their third qualifying score for the FEI Dressage World Cup™ Final. "I don't count anything until it's for certain," said Graves. "Once I went down centerline, I thought, 'Ok, hopefully this is my ticket to Sweden.'

"Honestly I started thinking about this venue and the sponsors that mean so much to me," commented Graves on how she felt during her ride on Friday night. "This is my last freestyle here this year. That was what went through my mind, not anything through the test. I wasn't hardly thinking about that, I was thinking more about all of what has happened in six years here for me. It was different perspective for me."

Kasey Perry-Glass (USA) and

Goerklintgaards Dublet took second place in the freestyle with a score of 83.875%, their second highest score ever. "He had a lot of energy. I wasn't expecting that," commented Perry-Glass on the 16-year-old Danish Warmblood gelding by Diamond Hit owned by Diane Perry. "Coming off of a show last week I thought he was going to be a little more tired, but he was actually more lit than I've felt him in a while. We had little bucks and switches. It's a good thing for him."

Adrienne Lyle (USA) and Salvino came in third with a score of 80.160%, also their secondhighest score together. "What I was happy with is that he really just pulled it all together when we went down centerline," said Lyle of the 12-year-old Hanoverian gelding by Sandro Hit owned by Betsy Juliano LLC. "He really let me keep my leg on and push him into the bridle better and get a little bit more consistent power throughout the test."

Judge at C, Irina Maknami commented, "For me, it was really a pleasure to judge these fantastically talented ladies with their amazing horses. It's really a special feeling when you see them and think, 'I'm so lucky to be a judge,' to be able to enjoy this. I think they're just great. There was so much progress, and I wish them the best of luck at the World Cup Finals."

Betsy Juliano of Havensafe Farm said, "It was breathtaking for me. The point of being here year after year and why we value being here at this wonderful facility is to watch and promote the horse's training. One of the great joys, in addition to knowing these three women – who are all very dear to me – is watching their horses improve year after year. I was so thrilled to stand there with these three who I love so much and to see them do so well. It doesn't get better than that."

# **AGDF HOSTS SEVENTH ANNUAL**

FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DRESSAGE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The seventh annual Florida International Youth Dressage Championships (FIYDC) were held during AGDF 8 and featured young riders in five divisions competing in FEI competition for top honors.

The 2019 FIYDC offered competition for riders in the Under 25, Young Rider, Junior Rider, Children and Pony divisions, offering them a chance to compete on the big stage in the Global International Arena at AGDF and showcase their talent at one of the world's largest and most high-profile dressage competitions.

This year there were 13 horse and rider pairs in the FEI U25 division, 11 entries in the FEI Young Rider division, six in the FEI Junior Rider Division, one in the FEI Children division, and three in the FEI Pony Rider division. The riders represented four countries, including Canada, Germany, Spain, and the United States.

Natalia Bacariza Danguillecourt (ESP), a 17-year-old from Madrid, Spain, was the division winner in both the FEI Young Rider and FEI Junior Rider divisions. Danguillecourt rode Dhannie Ymas, a 12-year-old Hanoverian gelding by Don Crusador owned by Yeguada de Ymas in the Young Rider division. The pair earned a score of 72.843% in the FEI Young Rider Team test on Friday, a score of 72.500% in the FEI Young Rider Individual test on Saturday, and a score of 74.742% in the FEI Young Rider Freestyle on Sunday.


Bacariza rode Romantico Ymas, a nine-year-old Hanoverian gelding by Bellissimo owned by Yeguada de Ymas, in the FEI Junior Rider division. The pair earned a score of 69.596% in the FEI Junior Rider Team test on Friday, a score of 70.882% in the FEI Junior Rider Individual test on Saturday, and a score of 76.458% in the FEI Junior Rider Freestyle on Sunday.

Bacariza won the overall champion title at FIYDC for the second year in a row, after winning all six of the classes that she competed in with her two different mounts. "They are completely different," said Bacariza of her two horses. "Dhannie is more with you and he loves being the center of attention. When he goes in the ring he's like 'I'm a star'.

"I'm not as confident with Romantico yet because this is my first year competing him, and he hasn't done CDI before," continued Bacariza. "It's a learning process together, but I'm super happy with how it's going. I'm so happy with the way it turned out. To have the highest overall mark, I was also very, very happy."

Natalie Pai (USA), a 21-yearold from Wellington, FL, and Unlimited won the Under 25 division, presented by Diamante Farms. The pair earned a score of 68.590% in the FEI Grand Prix on Friday morning and a 71.208% in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle on Sunday.







at first for her. "That choreography was actually about 18 months in the making. However, when I was first working on it, we couldn't do it. It was way too challenging for both Soli and I." commented Shoemaker. "We kept at it and then last summer before our U.S. Team Invitational Event before WEG, we rode this choreography for the first time and it came out really well," concluded Shoemaker.

In the FEI Para Freestyle Grade III - CPEDI 3\*, Rebecca Hart (USA) and Fortune 500 won with a score of 73.000%. Grade III is for riders who have severe impairments in both lower limbs with minimal or no impairment of the trunk or moderate impairments of the upper and lower limbs and trunk. Some riders in Grade III may use a wheelchair.

"I loved that I was able to get the walk the way that wanted it with him," said Hart of the nine-year-old Oldenburg gelding owned by Rowan O'Riley. "His trot work rode to a score of 61.927%. is always elastic and fluid, and I just wanted to feel the walk a little more in there and get it a little more consistent and

"We were able to do that, so that was super. It was a nice feeling. I just wanted to be able to give him the trip that he deserved," continued Hart, "His best quality is probably how hard he tries. Once he figures out what you want, he's a very honest horse."

Alanna Flax-Clark (USA) and El Paso, her 15-year-old the FEI Para Team Test Grade II - CPEDI 3\* with a score of 66.212%. Grade II is for riders who mainly use wheelchairs Shoemaker's freestyle test was actually a bit of a challenge and have some combination of trunk, arm, or leg impairments.

In the FEI Para Team Test Grade III – CPEDI 3\*, Hart and Fortune 500, won with a score of 68,529%. Shoemaker and Solitaer 40 won the FEI Para Team Test Grade IV – CPEDI 3\* with a score of 72.00%.

There two riders competing at the Grade V level on Friday. Grade V is for riders who have a mild impairment of movement or muscle strength, or a deficiency of one limb or mild deficiency of two limbs. Grade V is also for riders with some visual Impairment.

In the FEI Para Team Test Grade V - CPEDI 3\*. Lee Garrod (CAN) and Question, her 12-year-old Oldenburg gelding by Quaterback, rode to a win with a score of 65.000%. Cynthia Screnci (USA) and Sally L, her 15-year-old Hanoverian mare by Satisfaction, concluded the day of competition with a win in the FEI Para Novice Test A Grade V - CPEDI 1\*. The pair

Saturday started with another win for Trunnell and Dolton this time in the FEI Para Individual Champ Test Grade I -CPEDI 3\* with a score of 75.476%. Flax-Clark and El Paso won the FEI Para Individual Champ Test Grade II - CPEDI 3\* with a score of 65.294%.

In the FEI Para Individual Champ Test Grade III - CPEDI 3\*, Hart and Fortune 500 won with a score of 68.284%. Shoemaker and Solitaer 40 won the FEI Para Individual Champ Test Grade IV - CPEDI 3\* with a score of 74,309%. Garrod and Question concluded the day with a win in the FEI Para Individual Champ Test Grade V - CPEDI 3\* with a score



# What does the rest of the season look like for you?


I have one more competition, and I'm just really going to work on building a better relationship with my pony and improving our scores by improving our partnership.















# **CHRISTOPH KOSCHEL**

Makes It Three In A Row at Palm Beach Dressage Derby



Christoph Koschel won his third consecutive Palm Beach Dressage Derby presented by Havensafe Farm riding Action Ace. ©SusanStickle.com Christoph Koschel (GER) started off Friday evening at AGDF 8 by defending his title and for the third time winning the Palm Beach Derby presented by Havensafe Farm, picking up an \$3,000 check as his portion of the \$8,000 prize money on offer. Koschel rode Action Ace, a 14-year-old Danish Warmblood gelding by ljsselmeer owned by Janice Murdoch, and the new pair earned a score of 72.316% in the final round of the Derby.

"It's great to win the third time in a row," said Koschel of his success. "It's really challenging. I think that is what we all enjoy as professional riders, to get a horse that we don't know and find in four to five minutes the right buttons. To get to know the horse a little bit and then try to ride a test."

Karen Lipp (USA) also rode Action Ace in the final round and took second place with a score of 68.713%. Adrienne Lyle (USA) and Karen Pavicic (CRO) tied for third place after being "knocked out" by Koschel and Lipp in the initial round of competition. Lyle and Flash Dancer IM 1175, a 16-yearold Hanoverian gelding by Londonderry owned by Patricia Koschel, earned a score of 67.999%. Pavicic and Leuchtfeuer DE, a 14-year-old Swedish Warmblood stallion by Dion Romantica owned by Dressage Grand Ducal, earned a score of 67.705%.

Juliano shared, "This class has been a historical aspect of the [Palm Beach Dressage Derby] for many years, and it is fantastic that we keep it going. I was really thrilled to be a part of it. You [the riders] put yourself out there to learn how to ride these different horses in a very fast period of time, and you all did a really fantastic job. It's really a credit to you as professionals. It was wonderful."

Director of Dressage at AGDF, Thomas Baur said, "It's the Palm Beach Derby Week, and when I came here first there was no derby in the derby, and I said, 'We need to change that.' Then I remembered about the Munich Derby and how they did it there, and so I copied the format to bring it here."
