### **RISING AMERICAN STAR EQUINES -**

Dominate AGDF 5 Competition

Two stellar USA riders stole the limelight in week five of the 2020 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC) in Wellington, Florida. In the World Cup™ classes, Steffen Peters and Suppenkasper were unbeatable, and in the three-star classes, it was Ashley Holzer and her new star Mango Eastwood who topped both classes.

Peters had been somewhat apprehensive of the effect of the cauldron-like atmosphere for the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI-W, presented by Helgstrand Dressage, under lights on Friday night would have on the sensitive Suppenkasper, but the nimble 18.2hh gelding by Spielberg kept his tension at bay and produced fluid and powerful work to be rewarded with a new career high of 83.495%. Their previous best was 80.99%, awarded in California in April 2019.

Olivia LaGoy-Weltz (USA) finished second on Lonoir (79.365%), with Denmark's Agnete Kirk Thinggaard filling third with 77.635% on Blue Hors Zatchmo.

Of his ride on Four Winds Farm's "Mopsie", Peters said: "It felt wonderful. I knew when the music

started and he was still walking — usually we're piaffing and passaging with one hind leg going to the moon — from then on I knew there was a very good chance that he would just stand still. From there he was right with the music the entire time.

"This is one of those freestyles that I've visualized for many days — many mornings, many nights, throughout dark times — and it worked out beautifully," added the 55-year-old, whose result secured qualification for the World Cup™ Final in Las Vegas in April.

"There were a few tears that I wiped away. I kept telling Mopsie, 'It looks like we're going to Vegas.' I told him that a bunch of times, but I think I was a bit more excited about it than he was. It's a huge accomplishment and something we dreamed of every single day."

The pair will remain in Wellington and contest the CDI5\* in week seven (February 19-23) and the Nations Cup show in week 10 (10-15 March) before returning home to California.

Second-placed Olivia LaGoy-Weltz was delighted to pull off another fault-free freestyle with her long-time partner Lonoir after having topped the freestyle in week three with over 80%.

"In the warm-up and in the ring he was super," said the Vermont-based rider. "For the horse's [large] size, there are a lot of things that come one right after the other in that test, and he handled it super well. This is only the second time we've shown [this freestyle], so we'll keep making it better."

Judge at C, Canadian Lee Tubman, praised the standard of the class: "There was a high degree of difficulty in so many of the freestyles and the choreography was quite complicated. The big payoff is when the execution comes off technically clean. That's big points and that's what we like to give people."

The FEI Grand Prix Special CDI3\* on Saturday was the first time Ashley Holzer's ride Mango Eastwood had ever contested a special, and this was the pair's international debut.

### SARAH LOCKMAN RECORDS

Multiple Wins at AGDF 6 National

National dressage competition continued apace in week six of the 2020 Adequan® Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC) in Wellington, Florida.

It was a bumper week for USA rider Lockman and her mount Balia. The pair topped Saturdav's open Prix St. Georges with over 74%, and followed up with a win in the Future Challenge class at the level on Sunday with 73.603%. The eight-year-old German-bred mare by Belissimo M out of a Florestan dam is owned by the class sponsor, Summit Farm. Lockman bolstered her success by also topping the USEF developing Prix St. Georges class riding her own horse, Dehavilland, by Diamond Hit, to another plus-73% score.

"Balia's still young and green and we missed a couple of the changes, so if it was a clean test, I think it could have been over 75%," said Lockman, who is based in California and is spending the season in Wellington for the first time. "It's been a really great week for both my younger horses. Dehavilland needs ring experience, but I'm really proud of Balia, who we bought from Helgstrand here in Wellington when she was five. She'd only been here about two days.

"Balia's been a lovely addition to our string of horses," she added. "She's also part of the USEF developing program, so they have their eye on her. And I've owned Dehavilland since a foal, so it's really special to have seen him come up from an ugly duckling with a big head and ears — his nickname is Donkey — to his score from today which puts him at number one in the country.

"It's been a really great start to the season," added Lockman, who debuted the 10-year-old stallion First Apple, her Pan American Games individual gold medal ride, at grand prix level the previous week, scoring over 70%. "It's especially good for the young horses to have a horse show available every weekend here. They spend an hour doing

their thing, then we go back to my trainer Scott Hassler's barn and the horses go back out in the field.

"I feel really lucky," concluded the 31-year-old. "Not many riders have such a pipeline of horses coming through. I feel fortunate to have Summit Farm so behind me in my career and all the help l've had from Scott, who has been there since the very beginning with these horses. I feel like I'm set up for the future."

USA rider Heather Blitz slotted into second place of the eight-strong class with 73.015%. Riding the seven-year-old mare Limei De Lys, by Londonderry, she took the second qualifying spot on offer.

Lockman and her sponsor were keen to support the Future Challenge class: "We think it's really important for the sport and for riders and trainers to be encouraged to bring out the next top horses," she said. "We at Summit Farm wanted to create more hype and a more rewarding route for those who are developing these young horses. They are the future of our sport."

At big tour in the Lövsta Future Challenge class, the 61-year-old Olympian Jan Ebeling — who was







The bouncy black gelding by Wynton garnered 74.128% and lived up to his rider's rightful high opinion of him.

Holzer — who rode for Canada for many years, including at four Olympic Games — switched nationalities three years ago and teamed up with Mango Eastwood two years ago. The pair edged out compatriot Nick Wagman on Beverly Gepfer's 11-year-old Johnson gelding Don John

The top two spots were filled by the two youngest horses in the class. Sabine Schut-Kerv rounded out the all-American podium riding Alice Womble's 14-year-old San Remo stallion, Sanceo, to 71.532%.

Holzer was effusive about Mango Eastwood's performance, particularly as the horse was originally destined to be ridden by his owner, Diane Fellows: "We bought him from Jordi Domingo in Spain for Di to ride. Then I stole him. He was a green grand prix horse and I thought he'd be a good schoolmaster for her, but as we started working him a bit more, and he got hotter and hotter. It's been a bit of a journey getting him ready because he got quite spicy as he got fitter. He's a lovely animal and I'm very lucky to

Holzer and her husband Rusty relocated from Manhattan to Wellington two years ago. "It was always a dream of mine to live here," added the 56-year-old. "I love it here and Global is really the reason we moved down

The small tour CDI3\* classes all went the way of the brand-new combination of Denmark's Carina

Nevermann Torup and Bordolino 8, an eight-year-old by Bordeaux. The 30-year-old, who works at Helgstrand Dressage in both Denmark and Wellington, had teamed up with the horse just a week before the show. They pulled off three plus-70% wins from three starts, culminating in a 73.76% in the FEI Intermediate I Freestyle CDI3\*, presented by Wellington Regional Medical Center. This was despite having to add in an impromptu circle to stay with the music as it was the pair's first ever run-through of this freestyle routine.

"I trained the owner, Dongseon Kim, a bit, so I know the horse but I'd never sat on him before last Tuesday," said Nevermann Torup. "It's awesome that he actually won, but when you have a horse that's well ridden, it's quite easy to get on them. He's an awesome horse and he gives such a nice feeling in the ring. It was so cool to get a win on this side of the

She was another rider to praise the horse-friendly set-up at AGDF, adding: "It's made for competition and everything has been thought about. The footing is great, and everything just works."

Starting out the week on Thursday, Guenter Seidel (USA) and Louise Leatherdale's Beltano recorded their first international win together, topping the FEI Prix St. Georges CDI1\* with 72.892%. The 11-year-old gelding by Belissimo M pipped Bon Coeur 1389 and his Swedish rider Caroline Darcourt into second by the narrowest of margins, with just 0.1% dividing the top two in a class of 16 starters. The winning score was a new personal best for Seidel and Beltano at the level.

In the FEI Intermediate I CDI1\* on Saturday, it was a USA one-two-three, with Benjamin Ebeling — son of Olympic rider Jan — emerging victorious. He rode his mother Amy Roberts Ebeling's 12-year-old gelding Behlinger to 68.765%. This was only the second senior CDI for the California-based rider who has campaigned the son of Breitling W in young rider ranks in the USA and Europe. The 20-year-old is also a keen showjumper alongside his dressage career.

Ebeling's compatriot Anna Marek, 30, finished second on Snoopy Sunday, with whom she won the freestyle at the level in week one of the 2020 AGDF. The 11-year-old gelding, by the Sandro Hit son Sungold, scored 68.117%. Kasey Perry-Glass — best known for her partnership with her Rio Olympic bronze medallist horse Goerklintgaards Dublet — rode the 13-year-old gelding Mistico TM into third with 67.941%. Perry-Glass bought the son of Donnerball from Spanish rider Juan Matute Guimon four years ago and this week marks the pair's international debut.


