

Steffen Peters and Suppenkasper Dance to Freestyle Victory Under the Lights

The USA's Steffen Peters and Suppenkasper welcomed a victory in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI5*, presented by CaptiveOne Advisors, in the first "Friday Night Stars" competition of the season. Week seven of the 2021 Adequan[®] Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) concludes on Sunday, February 28, at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC) in Wellington, FL. The circuit hosts 10 weeks of international and national dressage competition until April 4. Free live streaming and on-demand of select classes are available to view at globaldressagefestival.com.

Peters and Suppenkasper, Akiko Yamazaki and Four Winds Farm's 2008 KWPN gelding by Spielberg, danced under the lights at Equestrian Village to a score of 80.995%.

"There were lots of things that were great," began Peters. "The piaffe felt really good, great halfpasses, the pirouette felt good. To me, one of the highlights of 'Mopsie' now, that used to be so difficult, is the collected walk. I used to have to hide that a little bit in the corner, but now I'm doing it on the diagonal because I can really show the relaxation. That might look like a boring movement, but to me it's huge. Of course, I risked a little bit much in that one extension, so he broke; one little fumble. The rest felt great."

Despite having no general attendance, the night still had its usual buzz of excitement, and Suppenkasper handled the atmosphere like a pro. Peters rode to a slightly different floor plan than normal, and despite some miscommunication, still pulled off the +80%.

"The floor plan was different this time," he said. "I do the extended walk 20 meters and then another 20 meters collected walk across the diagonal. So, the half-passes are going the opposite way. I think that was slightly confusing to the judges. There was a little miscommunication before, but it was my fault. I should have been clearer about it.

"One thing you don't want to do, you don't want to confuse the judges. And I did," he said with a smile.

The pair have finished competing at AGDF, and they will resume their training with the hope of making it onto the final USA Dressage shortlist. Peters concluded, "We decided to bubble wrap him from here and preserve him and head back to California next week."

Second place in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI5*, presented by CaptiveOne Advisors went to Yvonne Losos De Muniz (DOM) on Aquamarijn, her own 2005 KWPN mare by United, with 77.070%. Of her mount and their night's performance, Losos De Muniz said, "Tonight [Aquamarjin] felt amazing. I always go full out; 100 percent for everything. If I get it, that's great; if I don't, it's a disaster. I like riding like that, and I did it again tonight. I went full out on certain things that I paid for at the end, but that's the part I like about it, seeing how much I can push it. I'm not very good at being conservative. Some of the things I pushed. I've never felt before, like the pirouettes. The passage [and] piaffe is also getting a lot better. I can push a little more. I tend to always have to push it to the edge, so I do it. If I don't get it, I don't.

Equine Clinic, the USA's Sabine Schut-Kery and Sanceo took the highest honors of the class with a 74.522%.

Schut-Kery and Alice Womble's 2006 Hanoverian stallion by San Remo re-entered competition after a summer break in November, earning scores of over 74% in the CDIs in California before arriving in Florida in January. Those classes, along with a national class last week at AGDF, helped prepare the pair for their biggest competition in a year.

Second place in the FEI Grand Prix for Special CDI5*, presented by Palm Beach Equine Clinic went to another current short list pair, Adrienne Lyle (USA) on Harmony's Duval, Duval Partners LLC's 2008 KWPN gelding by Rosseau, with a 72.587%. Third place honors were presented to Charlotte Jorst (USA) on Kastel's Nintendo, Kastel Denmark's 2003 KWPN stallion by Negro, with 72.326%, who is also sitting on the short list behind Schut-Kery and Lyle.

Germany's Frederic Wandres topped the leaderboard in the FEI Prix St. Georges CDI3*, presented by Donato Farms piloting Hof Kasselmann's 2013 Hanoverian gelding by Hochadel, Harrods 3, to a final score of 74.382%.

In the FEI Grand Prix CDI3* for Freestyle, presented by Premier Equestrian, Australia's Kelly Layne earned a career high score of 71.935% with Kelly Layne and Nori Maezawa's 2009 Oldenburg gelding by Sir Donnerhall I, Samhitas.

FRIDAY

Friday night began with the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI3*, presented by Premier Equestrian. Australia's Kelly Layne topped that class with a fierce freestyle created by Gary Patterson. Layne and Samhitas, the 2009 Oldenburg gelding by Sir Donnerhall I that she co-owns with Nori Maezawa, topped the class with a 76.500%.

"He actually felt really, really good in the test tonight," expressed Layne. "He was a little bit nervous walking in because he hasn't done this for a year, but the moment the music came on, he got a little excited, and once we went in it was like he was

Guenter Seidel (USA) on Equirelle, Leatherdale Farms and Louise Leatherdale's 2009 KWPN mare by Florett AS, closed out the top three with a 75.560%. The evening was the mare's first time competing at night under the lights, and Seidel was impressed with how she stepped up to the plate.

"For the state we're in in our partnership," he explained, "I was pleased with her. Compared to [Yvonne] riding at 100 percent, I only ride at 50 percent. Hopefully that will change in the future, but I'm very pleased with her and I'm super happy with how she handled it all and how she presented herself. Nothing was perfect, but she stayed with me the whole time. It was overall a harmonious ride, and I think that's what everyone is looking for."

Judge at C Michael Osinski applauded the evening's rides, noting the quality of the performances and of the entire event. "Certainly, we have to say that in light of the current environment, it's exceptional to be here," admitted Osinski. "It's wonderful to see such high-quality riding. We just owe kudos to the organization, to all of the people that participate in this, and to the riders for being here. It's very special."

AGDF Director of Sport Thomas Baur concluded, "It's really important to have a five star here in the U.S, as it's the only one in the Western Hemisphere. I think the turnout for the five star and the quality is more or less 90 percent of the top riders here in the country. I'm happy about that, and we'll continue to offer the five star in the future."

glued to me. I felt like I was floating. I think we were!"

Jennifer Williams (USA) and her own Sueno Hit, a 2008 Oldenburg gelding by Sandro Hit, rode away with second place honors after earning a 71.860% in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle CDI3*, presented by Premier Equestrian. Dongseon Kim (KOR) on DSK Belstaff, his own 2007 Hanoverian stallion by Brentano II, earned a 70.085% that put them in third place.

Earlier in the day, Peters topped the FEI Prix St. Georges CDI1* aboard Five Rings Farm's 2012 Oldenburg stallion by Bordeaux, Boreas FRF, with a 74.706%.

In the FEI Intermediaire I CDI3^{*}, presented by Donato Farms, Dongseon Kim (KOR) took home the win on his own Lord Nunes, a 2012 Rheinlander stallion by Lord Loxley I, with 71.177%.

"I feel so much joy and have happy tears," began Schut-Kery. "It's very emotional. Aside from those feelings, to ride the test, you are focused in there of course, but it's also joyful. It's an amazing feeling to have an animal like that to respond to you in there with such small aids and cues. That amazing feeling is still there for me after 30-plus years, how we can communicate with an animal like that."

Kellock and Sebastien, Enterprise Farm Equestrian LLC, and Lindsay Kellock's 2006 Rheinlander gelding by Sandro Hit, captured second place after riding to a 73.234%. Adrienne Lyle (USA) rounded out the top three with Harmony's Duval, Duval Partners LLC's 2008 KWPN gelding by Rosseau, earning a 73.149%.

Who has been the most influential person in your equestrian career, and why?

One person is too few! When I first started riding, my father was the most influential person in my career. My father was not a horse person, but he always pushed me to do the best. Often when I'm thinking about difficult decisions, I come back to him and he is always there to help me. More recently, the Kasselmann family in Hagen has been very influential to me as a rider. The Kasslemann family has allowed me many opportunities to ride exceptional horses from all ranges, from young prospects to Grand Prix on a world-class level. This kind of support is not just given, and I am very appreciative of the support system that I have.

You have earned many top scores at all levels, including your personal best Grand Prix high score of 76.60% in CDI4* as well as earning an 82.55% in Gothenburg in the Grand Prix Freestyle. What further career goals do you have for yourself?

Overall, I do not want to put too much pressure on myself with specific score goals. When the test is good and my horse gives me a good rideable feeling during the show, I am happy. In general, I try not to look too much into the future because you never know what will happen the next day. Many riders have that "once-in-a-lifetime horse" and then that is it. My goal is to develop younger horses to the highest international levels. My dream would be to one day ride a championship for Germany.

What horse are you most excited about for this upcoming season?

To be honest, all of them. Due to COVID-19, we were given a longer break than usual and now we are able to show how the horses have developed at home during this break. Overall, I have great hopes for all of my horses that I am currently working with.

What most excites you about your first season at AGDF?

It is my first season here in Wellington, so I am excited to make some memories! Americans, and especially the Wellington crowd spectators, are amazing and extremely supportive. They support all of us whether it was a good day or not! I feel that this "good vibe" also translates to horses!

How have you prepared for this AGDF 2021 season?

In my opinion, preparation is everything. You have to do your job at home during the training. I don't like to train the horses with difficult exercises on the showground. Most of the horses have other things on their mind when they have been traveling or are staying overnight in a new stable. Due to that, I don't want to ask too much of them at shows. That's the reason why I think you have to work well and concentrate at home to let your horses shine in the arena.

A Q&A WITH UP-AND-COMING DRESSAGE STAR BEN EBELING

Twenty-one-year-old Benjamin Ebeling (USA) made his senior international grand prix debut this season after a successful career in the Under 25 division of the sport. Last week during AGDF 7, Ben notched not one, but two personal best scores and victories in both the FEI Grand Prix CDI3* and the FEI Grand Prix Special CDI3^{*}, presented by Hygain Feeds.

This was your first season out of the U25 Division. What has that transition been like for you? BE: In my opinion the transition has been more noticeable than I first expected. In the senior tour you need to be much more accurate, have a little bit more collection than in the U25 test, and have more power in that collection all the way around. That was something I did not anticipate, but I have a really great team around me and they have prepared me well. So, I think that the transition has gone fairly well.

What was it like to head down centerline in your first senior international grand prix this season? BE: I was a little nervous at first, but I found that that just goes away after you actually get into the ring and start focusing on the task at hand... but honestly, I haven't been that nervous for a horse show since I showed my pony when I was like nine! However, it went very well, and I think it's a testament to my team and the coaches that I have behind me. My dad [Jan Ebeling] has done a really great job of preparing me, and Christoph [Koschel], I've also been riding under his watchful eye, and it's been extremely helpful. Not to mention I've also been working a little bit with Gary Rockwell on test riding and accuracy, so I couldn't be more grateful for all of their help and guidance.

You hit a few personal bests last week [AGDF 7]. What are your thoughts about that accomplishment? BE: It was a personal best, but for me I think I could still do better. There were a couple things with my riding [particularly in the Grand Prix] that I was not too happy about. They're things that in the future I'm hoping to fix, and I think it will come even more with time. As I said, although it's a personal best and I was really happy with that, I think overall, I'm just working on fixing every detail.

Could you tell us more about your relationship with Illuster Van De Kampert?

BE: The horse means so much to me. This horse in particular - I'm really close with both owners of him - my mom owns part of the horse and another owner has really helped me out on this journey. Illuster, aka "Big Dog," is a special one. I really enjoy my time with him. I take him out to graze every afternoon, to hand walk, and I groom him every day. He's really taught me that having a good connection with the horse can mean a lot in the show arena.

Has there been one particular piece of advice that you've received this season that has really stuck with you? BE: Robert Dover has been helping me a lot with going over my tests, and one thing that he's said to me is that having power in the collection is very important for a grand prix test. That's one thing that I'm trying to translate in the show arena.

What are your plans for the rest of the season? BE: I guess we still have to take it day-by-day with COVID, but [AGDF Director of Sport] Thomas [Baur] and the team have done an excellent job with keeping the show extremely safe, and I'm really hoping we can finish out strong. We'll take it day-by-day, and we'll go from there!
