BONJOUR, PARIS! US Equestrian Teams Keep Eyes on the Prize

he clock is ticking, the countdown started, and with each passing day, the Paris 2024 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games becomes more of a reality for the US Equestrian staff and the teams who will head abroad in July of 2024, with the aim

of bringing medals back to the United States.

With all four U.S. teams qualified for the summer Games, three Olympic teams and one Paralympic team, the U.S. contingent will be eyeing success, similar to 2021, which saw the U.S. Dressage Team, U.S. Jumping Team, and U.S. Para Dressage Team all capture team medals.

Paris, the city of love and lights, will open its doors to the world from July 26 to September 8, 2024, showcasing 32 sports and welcoming more than 10,000 athletes for the Olympic and Paralympic Games, with equestrian events taking place in the gardens

of the iconic Château de Versailles, just an hour west of city central.

For the Sport Department at US Equestrian, plans have been in motion for more than four years, working through the challenges of Olympic and Paralympic logistics, horse flights, shipping and

> equipment manifests, transportation for staff and athletes, groom accommodations, and much more. Ensuring optimum field of play performance for competing combinations is the sole focus of U.S. team staff, providing athletes the ability to zone in and tune out distractions during the Games.





How It Works

Each of the four equestrian disciplines represented across the Games has a team and individual qualification process governed by the Fédération Equestre International (FEI), followed by an application and selection process overseen by US Equestrian for U.S. combinations. The team selection process includes input of the team's Chefs d'Equipe, team veterinarians and support staff, and others, and must be officially signed off by the **US** Equestrian Board of Directors and United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee (USOPC) prior to announcement.

"Like with every Olympic & Paralympic Games, there are many complexities with the logistics around these types of championships, which ultimately impacts the scope and detail of our planning," said Hallye Griffin, USEF Director of FEI Sport.

"Since we are outside of Paris, in

Versailles, it's about an hour to the Olympic Village, which means we have the element of planning and securing additional lodging, housing, and transportation. These Games will be challenging when it comes to security, transportation, and access, which is something we've been preparing for. The gardens where equestrian competitions will take place are within the Château grounds, but still significant walking distance from the palace itself, so looking through all those details to understand how we can best support our staff, athletes, grooms, and owners are all items on our radar."

The disciplines of dressage, jumping, and para dressage all use a Short List as part of their selection methodology, which typically includes eight to ten horse-and-athlete combinations designated for potential team selection, all determined by a range of factors, including performance at identified

Observation Events leading into the final selection period. The Olympic and Paralympic teams will be formally announced in late June to early July with the official entry deadline of the FEI and USOPC.

Competition Formats

Tokyo 2020 saw significant format changes for the three Olympic disciplines, with many of those changes still in place for Paris 2024, including a reduced number of team combinations from four to three for dressage, eventing, and jumping, meaning there is no available drop score for the teams, making every combination count towards the team total. This change has raised the stakes for all competitors, with the room for error marginal to earn a podium finish.

"We have a very condensed schedule this summer, which creates its own challenges in terms of how we manage the logistics around each of the teams," added Griffin. "In terms of the weather it

could be quite warm, and it could also be quite wet, hopefully it will be something in between. The weather can play a major role in terms of our approach to planning and how we can best prepare each of the disciplines for the potential circumstances they'll be competing in."

In a change to the Tokyo timetable, eventing will be the first equestrian discipline to compete at the grounds of Versailles and will operate in the same format as Tokyo 2020, with a team of three combinations contesting the three traditional phases of dressage, cross-country, and jumping. The competition will be held at the CCI5* level for dressage and jumping and CCI4* level for cross-country, hosted from July 26-29.

Team medals are determined by the lowest overall combined team scores following the jumping phase on Sunday. In a defining part of the championship format for eventing, a second round of jumping for the top 25 placed individual combinations following team competition, will ultimately crown three new individual medalists.

Dressage will move into the venue early in the week on July 26, starting with team medals determined by the overall finish of the team's three combinations in the FEI Grand Prix Special, while individual medals will be contested for in the FEI Grand Prix Freestyle. The top 18 combinations from the Grand Prix will qualify to move forward to contest the freestyle in a bid for individual medals.

Concluding the equestrian portion of the Olympics will be jumping, which will see team competition lead off their week-long schedule, a significant change in the format from three years ago, which saw individual medals awarded before the start of team competition. Following two rounds to determine team medals, three selected combinations will take on two additional rounds for the individual final.

Just under a month following the conclusion of the equestrian competition at the Olympics, the Paris 2024 Paralympics will begin, featuring combinations in five different Grades, I-V, with three combinations competing for the team and one individual combination representing the U.S. in three different tests – the FEI Para Dressage Team Test, FEI Para Dressage Individual Test, and FEI

Para Dressage Freestyles.

"All of our preparations carry over to the Paralympics as well. Our para team is equally as much of a focus for us as any of our Olympic teams. They had a great performance in Tokyo and have since continued to have success at many of our most recent championships. We're seeing the sport continue to grow and will make sure they are completely supported for the Paralympics too, since we know their aim is to replicate their championships results from the past two years," she added.

The Venue

When formally announced the gardens of Château de Versailles would host the equestrian disciplines, both excitement and proactivity from



national governing bodies ensued as the venue would pose some unusual logistical challenges as a deeply historic site with significant infrastructure buildout needs to accommodate world-class competition, but also usher in a fantastic opportunity to showcase the sport to a broader audience. The venue will include four arenas. including a covered training area, a gallop track, dedicated lunging arenas, while the main stadium will be built to seat nearly 10,000 spectators.

"The venue is an incredible setting for our sport, but also has provided significant demand in ticket acquisition, which has been challenging because there is such limited inventory available, which is a situation our sport hasn't traditionally been in," explained Griffin.

"From what has been communicated from the Organizing Committee, we're expecting spectator capacity will be completely full, creating an incredible atmosphere for competition, but will simultaneously limit our ability to offer as many tickets as we are accustomed to from past Games."

SCHEDULE & HOW TO WATCH

Building on the fanfare and engagement from Tokyo 2020 will be key for the United States as we look ahead to Paris 2024, as the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic and Paralympics Games are just right around the corner, bringing a home summer games back to the United States since Atlanta 1996. With a venue location as unique and iconic as the gardens of Versailles, equestrian competitions have already seen a significant uptick in demand for tickets and access from the public.

NBC will once again air primetime coverage across the United States, showcasing the variety of sporting competitions across the Games, also available live on their streaming platform, Peacock, with regular programming and broadcasts available on regular cable television. Currently, the timetable for the disciplines will be as follows, but is subject to change.

3 Facts Veterinarians Wish You Knew about DJD

Get a better understanding of degenerative joint disease (DJD) and how you and your veterinarian can work together to help manage the disease in your horse.

egenerative joint disease (DJD) is a major cause of equine lameness. To help keep more horses moving, American Regent Animal Health, maker of Adequan® i.m. (polysulfated glycosaminoglycan), talked to a group of leading equine veterinarians. Here are their top insights about DJD.



1. DJD is an equal opportunity disease

Equine DJD, commonly called osteoarthritis, may cause lameness in horses of all ages and breeds. It is characterized by progressive deterioration of the articular cartilage along with changes in bone and soft tissues of the joint.¹

Veterinarians diagnose DJD, in part, by looking at radiographs. Dr. Kyla Ortved, the Jacques Jenny Endowed Term Chair of Orthopedic Surgery at the University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center, said she sees a lot of pre-purchase X-rays from people looking to buy young horses. "I'm finding that a lot of those pretty young horses have radiographic changes," Dr. Ortved says.

2. The earlier the better

A proactive joint-health approach for the average performance horse should include twice-a-year lameness exams and hoof radiographs to guide the farrier, according to Dr. Kent Allen, owner of Virginia Equine Imaging and a founder of the International Society of Equine Locomotor Pathology. Because DJD gets worse over time, it's important to manage it early in the disease process when treatment is most

effective for horses. "You're going to be able to [help] them. They're going to be successful at their job, and they're going to keep doing the job," Dr. Allen said. "And that's where I've focused my efforts on use of Adequan i.m. [polysulfated glycosaminoglycan], and I've found it very successful."





THE SPECTATOR'S GUIDE to Dressage Competition



Dressage

Dressage is a competitive equestrian sport, defined by the International Equestrian Federation (FEI) as "the highest expression of horse training." The rider will be relaxed and appear effort-free while the horse willingly performs the requested movement. In modern dressage competition, successful training at the various levels is demonstrated through the performance of "tests," prescribed series of movements ridden within a standard arena. Dressage is considered the most artistic of the equestrian sports and can be traced back centuries. The Freestyle is choreographed and performed to music.

Para Dressage

Para Dressage is the sport of Dressage for athletes with an impairment. Conducted under the same basic rules, but with athletes classified according to the level of their impairment, the horse has to perform at a walk, trot, and canter, and all tests are ridden from memory and follow a prescribed pattern of movements.

The only exception is the Freestyle which is choreographed for each horse and is performed to music. Para Dressage is the only Equestrian discipline included in the Paralympic Games, where it has been a regular fixture since 1996. The Paralympic Games are the second largest sporting event in the world after the Olympic Games, and are contested immediately after the Olympic Games in the same city and at the same venue.

Concours Dressage International: CDI

An acronym for Concours Dressage International, a dressage competition recognized by the FEI. As CDI-W, there are World Cup qualifying or World Cup classes at the show, as CDIO there are Olympic qualifying or Olympic classes at the show.

Dressage Riders To Watch

FREDERIC WANDRES

Frederic Wandres made a splash on the North American dressage scene in 2023 during his first winter season in Wellington. He walked away with six consecutive CDI victories and went on to bring home a team silver medal for Germany at the 2023 European Dressage Championships in Riesenbeck, Germany.

Frederic and Bluetooth OLD ended their debut year at the Adequan* Global Dressage Festival with a tour-high score and victory in the CDI5* Grand Prix Freestyle during the penultimate week of the season. He's hoping to pick up where he left off in 2024 and is back in top form once again. The 36-year-old starts the season ranked within the top 10 in the world on the FEI Dressage Rankings.

Born into a family with no connection to horses, Frederic got his start on the lunge line just like every other pony crazy kid. His fate was easily sealed on the back of a horse, and he began his training at the Kasselmann farm in Hagen.

As he rose to the top level, he collected accolades that include a 6-year-old World Championship, a victory in the Hamburg Dressage Derby on Westminster and a team bronze medal at the FEI World Championships in Herning 2022 riding Duke of Britain.

Most recently, Frederic and Bluetooth OLD claimed the second leg of the FEI Dressage World Cup Western European League in the World Cup™ Grand Prix in Lyon, France, this fall on a personal best of 83.415%.



Frederic and his string of horses led by Bluetooth OLD will return to the AGDF stadium and is a solid bet during Friday Night Stars.

ANNA MAREK

U.S. dressage rider Anna Marek is coming off a high of a season after she helped Team USA bring home gold at the 2023 Pan American Games in Santiago, Chile, this fall riding Fire Fly. The 34-year-old Florida native has pocketed many firsts at the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival. Arguably the most notable was her Nations Cup debut

with Dee Clair in 2020 that helped The Dutta Corp. U.S. Dressage Team secure gold at the Stillpoint Farm FEI Dressage Nations Cup™ USA.

Anna is a 5 star USDF gold medalist and started her competition career in 2001 after catching the horse bug

as she made her way through the North American Young Rider program. During that time, she was a working student for two-time Olympian Belinda Nairn and attracted generous sponsor Renee Isler. Together with a string of

impressive horsepower, Anna has won multiple championships in USDF Region 3 every year since 2013. In 2016, she eclipsed the top 20 in the U.S. national rankings. In 2023, Anna and her developing partner Duvel were selected as members of The Dutta Corp. U.S. Dressage Team that earned silver in FEI Dressage Nations Cup™ USA CDIO3*. Coming off a Pan American Games gold and sting of CDI

successes, Anna and her horses will be a force this season.

CHRISTIAN SIMONSON

Christian Simonson began competing at the FEI level in 2016 and launched a successful youth career. Hailing from California, Christian has climbed the ranks from within the Adequan® Global Dressage Festival stadium with no sign of slowing in 2024.

Christian started riding at the age of six and competing at national dressage shows at 13. He is an avid mountain biker, scuba diver and has his student's pilot license, but horses have become his main passion.

Highlighting his FEI North American Youth Championships appearances, Christian earned junior team gold and individual silver with Herzkonig in 2017, young rider team silver with FRH Rassolini in 2018, and young rider team gold, individual gold, and freestyle gold with Zeaball Diawind in 2021. He went on to ride Zeaball Diawind to the

Horseware Ireland/USEF Young Rider Dressage National Championship title that same year at the U.S. Dressage Festival of Champions.

Christian competed three times at Future Champions CDIY in Hagen, Germany, from 2021 through 2023 as part of the U.S. Dressage Young Rider European Tour, helping collect team bronze in 2021 with Zeaball Diawind and in 2023 with Son of a Lady.

In 2023, Simonson made his senior team debut at the FEI Dressage Nations Cup™ USA, winning team silver and individual gold in the FEI Intermediate I Freestyle with Son of a Lady. Later, the pair won the Neue Schule/USEF Intermediaire I Dressage National Championship at the U.S. Dressage Festival of Champions. Christian's most notable accolade to date, however, is helping team USA bring home gold at the 2023 Pan American Games in Santiago, Chile.



FIONA HOWARD

Para-Dressage

Fiona Howard is a member of the U.S. Para-Dressage Team and an allaround horsewoman. Her riding career began in Great Britain where she was born and raised with her American mother and British father. She started her love affair with horse sport when she got her first pony at three years of age. Her Pony Club career led to stints in the worlds of show jumping, eventing and polo, but her initial interest was drawn to reining thanks to a family friend's stable of reining horses.

Fiona was 14 when she earned a bronze medal at the 2013 FEI European Reining Championships for Juniors and Young Riders. She rode in the 2014 and 2015 National Reining Horse Association European Affiliate Championships and competed again as a junior in the FEI European Reining Championships in 2016.

Fiona immigrated to the U.S. in 2016



and rode in her first Para Dressage tests in 2021. She lives and rides with a condition called dystonia, which is a neuromuscular disease that causes Fiona's muscles to involuntarily contract and twist. Fiona began showing symptoms at 11 years old and as she grew older, she lost more ability to walk and move independently.

was inspired by the

When not riding, Fiona works remotely as a research assistant at Boston Children's Hospital where she was treated as a child.

KEVIN KOHMANN

A German-born American, Kevin Kohmann grew up as a pony kid in Germany and won a pony regional championship in 2002. Kevin, 35, came to the U.S. to work under several trainers and develop horses, and ultimately joined Diamante Farms in 2014 to call Wellington home.

Kevin made his CDI Grand Prix debut on Dinamico and then briefly competed Mr. Bumblebee and Inshallah on the large tour at the Adequan* Global Dressage Festival. The 2023 season at AGDF was a breakout one for Kevin as he took over the ride on Terri Kane's Duenensee. They finished fourth in


Pablo started riding at a summer camp in Valencia, and he chased that dream to Wellington a decade ago.

Global Dressage Festival (AGDF) is host to FEI-level U25 classes every CDI week and hosts the only CDIOU25 and CDIO events in North America. Along with developing European tours and additional Nations Cup events, dressage athletes gain the experience needed to excel on senior Nations Cup teams in the future.

NAYC provides juniors and young riders with a unique team experience and atmosphere while the annual RDHCW hosts 20 skilled riders, via invite only, to participate in lectures and lessons from renowned clinicians designed to assist in the development the next generation of U.S. dressage team talent. The U25 division has also become an increasingly important way for athletes between the ages of 16 and 25 (FEI age) to bridge the gap between the Young Rider and Grand Prix levels and provides access to USEF Dressage staff and coaches, including George Williams, the US Equestrian Dressage Youth Coach, as well as the High Performance &

Athletes Excelling on the Pathway

Many of the up-and-coming young dressage athletes today have progressed straight up the pathway, from NAYC to CDIU25 competitions, to Nations Cup teams and international championships.

Anna Buffini started her journey along the high performance pathway in 2014 at NAYC with a team gold medal and won the Grand Prix Freestyle U25 and team silver medal in the CDIOU25 at AGDF in 2017 with Sundayboy. With FRH Davinia la Douce, Buffini moved up to riding on Nations Cup teams in 2021. She qualified individually for the FEI Dressage World CupÔ Final in 2022 and 2023 and rode in the CDIO5* at CHIO Aachen this past July.

"If you want to be a top rider and a top competitor internationally, it is impossible without support. I'm so grateful for the foundations like the USET Foundation that make it possible to do all of this," said Buffini. "I think it's incredible that people are able to come together and help fund a team that's worked so hard to produce an Olympic medal. No matter what you give, no matter what you do, it's part of a bigger picture. It really can impact and change lives."

At a similar steep ascent in the sport, Christian Simonson competed in four NAYC events, taking home three medals before his final year in 2021, where he and Zeaball Diawind swept the gold medals in the Young Rider division. He moved up to Small Tour classes in 2022 and was a part of the Nations Cup CDIOY team at Future Champions in Hagen, Germany, and competed at CHIO Aachen in the Young Rider division.

In his breakout year of 2023, Simonson rode Son of a Lady on the silver-medal-winning team at the CDIO3* at AGDF and competed in Hagen again before being named to the U.S. Dressage team for the Pan American Games in Santiago, Chile, where he helped the team win gold.

Joining Simonson on the Young Rider team in Hagen, Germany, was West Coast-based Erin Nichols. Nichols and Handsome Rob AR had similar success at NAYC with team gold in 2021 and team silver and two individual gold medals in 2022. With Elian Royale, her current FEI mount, Nichols is the number eight-ranked U25 rider in the world. The pair participated in the 2023 U.S. Dressage European U25 Tour and placed third in the CDIU25 Grand Prix Freestyle at the CDI Twente in the Netherlands. At CDI Kronenberg, they won every CDIU25 class.

Codi Harrison has the special distinction of having ridden Katholt's Bossco, her gold-medal-winning mount from the 2023 Pan American Games, all the way from the Young Rider division. They picked up team bronze in the 2016 NAYC, were on the team for the silver medal at the 2022 CDIOU25 at AGDF, and then moved directly into the Grand Prix.

As part of the 2023 U.S. Dressage European U25 Tour, Ben Ebeling and Status Royal OLD won the CDIU25 Intermediate II test and placed second in the CDIU25 Grand Prix 16-25 test in Belgium. In Crozet, France, the pair swept the CDIU25 classes winning the CDIU25 Intermediate II test, the CDIU25 Grand Prix 16-25 test, and the CDIU25 Grand Prix 16-25 test, and the

Ebeling has a strong pathway journey, having won team gold at the 2017 NAYC, and already has senior team experience, including at the 2023 CDIO4* in Rotterdam, the Netherlands.



WEF 2023 Galloping into Glory

Record-Breaking Economic Impact Sets Palm Beach County Abuzz he Winter Equestrian
Festival (WEF) stands
as a testament to the
grandeur and international
appeal of equestrian sports.
Held annually in Palm Beach
County, Florida, the WEF
is the world's largest
equestrian competition,
attracting athletes from
over 34 countries and

all 50 U.S. states. This 13week extravaganza has more than 34,00 horse entries and is sanctioned by both the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI), commences in early January and concludes in early April. Beyond the thrilling horse competitions, the WEF has another remarkable aspect – its substantial economic impact on Palm Beach County.

In 2023, two surveys were conducted to assess the WEF's economic influence.
One survey targeted participants, including riders, owners, and trainers, while the other focused on spectators.
The participant survey

gathered data from 876 responses, surpassing the target of 400, and the sample was reduced to 764 after excluding Palm Beach County residents. The spending data of nonresident participants, who contribute "new" money to the county, revealed impressive results.

Nonresident participants injected a staggering \$351.7 million into Palm Beach County's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and supported 3,364 jobs. This contributed to labor earnings of \$103 million, with an average earnings per job of \$30,618.

A significant portion of this economic impact, \$262.5 million (74.6%), was attributed to direct horse-related expenditures, which averaged \$40,260 per horse. These direct expenditures stimulated additional economic activity within the county, resulting in over \$100 million in indirect expenditures.

The direct horse-related expenditures also generated labor earnings of \$78.3 million and created 2,690 jobs across various

industries in the local economy, with an average earnings per job of \$29,088.

Nonresident spectators, although attending only a fraction of the 12-week event, made a notable contribution. Their direct expenditures, totaling \$2.1 million during WEF 2023 Saturdays, boosted Palm Beach County's GDP by \$3.4 million, supporting 28 jobs and increasing labor earnings by approximately \$1 million. The average earnings per job for this segment were \$34,425.

The Winter Equestrian

Nonresident spectators, while attending fewer days, also play a crucial role by contributing directly to the local economy and enhancing the overall experience of the WEF.
