Tonkawa vs Pilot REMATCH

This past Wednesday, February 24, Tonkawa grabbed a crucial 14-12 victory over Pilot at the International Polo Club Palm Beach. The high-powered match saw three 10-goalers on the field, with Sapo Caset emerging as an unstoppable force for Tonkawa, finishing with 11 goals on 10 for 14 shooting from the field. Substituting for Cody Ellis, Lucas Escobar faced his former team and

excelled in pressuring brothers Facundo and Gonzalito Pieres off the ball to free space for Caset and Francisco Elizalde to attack goal, which contributed to an 8-1 run over the third and fourth chukkers. Despite conceding five penalty goals to Pilot, Tonkawa's efficient open play attack led them to the decisive victory and brought both teams even with a 1-1 record in Bracket II.



POLO SCHOOL at International Polo Club



The International Polo School is in full swing this season, entering its fourth year. The school is a full-service operation; offering lessons, stabling, four, six, and 8 goal leagues, coaching leagues, and horse leasing. The IPS also offers practice memberships which allow sponsors and their professionals to practice twice a week from January through April.

The School now offers 150+ stalls for rent which includes turnout, access to exercise tracks, and a

full-length stick and ball field. Gates Gridley and Ignacio "Nacho" Cabrera have built the program from 10 horses and 100 lessons in 2017 to 28 horses and over 600 lessons in 2020. The School operates from Tuesday through Sunday from October through May and has a string of horses that can accomodate any level of riding, whether you are a beginner looking to try a new sport, or an experienced player looking to participate in practices, leagues, or stick and ball.

C.V. WHITNEY CUP® HISTORY

Originally known as the U.S.
Handicap, the C.V. Whitney
Cup® was first competed
for in 1979 by handicap,
and played in conjunction
with the U.S. Open Polo
Championship®. Played at



Retama Polo Center in San Antonio, Texas, it was won the first two years by Tulsa. Nine years later, in 1988, the tournament was renamed for C.V. year, (Cornelius Vanderbilt "Sonny") Whitney, an avid polo player and three-time winner of the U.S. Open final. in 1928, 1937, and 1938, and son of 10-goal Hall of A not provided the polosystem.


Now played as a stand-alone tournament, the C.V. Whitney Cup® is the first of three 22-goal tournaments in the GAUNTLET OF POLO® at the International Polo Club Palm Beach (IPC) in Wellington, Florida. Its home since 2003, the C.V. Whitney Cup® will be followed by the USPA Gold Cup® and the U.S. Open Polo Championship®. In 2015 the Orchard Hill team defeated Alegria in the highest-scoring final in C.V. Whitney Cup® history 16-13. Orchard Hill defended their title in 2016, defeating Audi 11-9, but the defending champions lost the trophy to rival Valiente in 2017 14-11. Notable past winners include Valiente (2012, 2014, 2017, 2018), Lechuza (1999, 2002, 2011), and White Birch (1995, 1996, 2000, 2001 and 2005).

History was made during the first GAUNTLET OF POLO® in 2019, when Pilot captured the C.V. Whitney Cup® to start a run to capture all three events, win the \$500,000 bonus and earn \$1

million over the course of the series. Surviving a fierce single-elimination tournament in 2019, Pilot and Las Monjitas emerged out of a field of 16 challengers to contend for the C.V. Whitney Cup®, which

was ultimately won 13-6 by Pilot. Reaching the C.V. Whitney Cup® Final for the second consecutive year, Las Monjitas emerged as the champions in 2020, defeating La Indiana 11-10 in the hard-fought final

A new champion will be crowned in 2021, with nine teams competing for the first leg of the GAUNTLET OF POLO® including newcomers Aspen/Dutta Corp and Scone, which features father/son duo Adolfo Cambiaso and Adolfo 'Poroto' Cambiaso Jr. The 10-goalers competing this year include Cambiaso (Scone), Sapo Caset (Tonkawa), Facundo and Gonzalito Pieres (Pilot), Polito Pieres (La Indiana), and Hilario Ulloa (Park Place). The winner of the C.V. Whitney Cup® will receive \$100,000 in prize money while the runners-up receive \$25,000. In partnership with USPA Global Licensing, each of the teams will select a charity of their choice from 10 non-profits and both charities of the winner and runners-up will receive a \$5,000 donation. Showcasing many young and talented polo players, the competition includes active Team USPA Members Peke Gonzalez, Keko Magrini, Nico Escobar, and Timmy Dutta, and graduating members Jared Zenni, Cody Ellis and Matt Coppola.
